The following terms and conditions are hereby expressly incorporated into this permit to operate:

1. This permit to operate shall be effective until 07/06/98
You will be contacted approximately six months prior to this date regarding the renewal of this permit. If you are not contacted, please write to the appropriate Ohio EPA field office.
2. The above-described source is and shall remain in full compliance with all applicable State and federal laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit.
3. Prior to any modification of this source, as defined in rule 3745-31-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), a permit to install must be granted by the Ohio EPA pursuant to OAC Chapter 3745-31.
4. The Director of the Ohio EPA or an authorized representative may, subject to the safety requirements of the permit holder, enter upon the premises of this source at any time for purposes of making inspections, conducting tests, examining records or reports pertaining to any emission of air contaminants, and determining compliance with any applicable State and federal air pollution laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit.
5. A permit fee in the amount specified above must be remitted within 15 days from the issuance date of this permit.
6. Any transferee of this permit shall assume the responsibilities of the prior permit holder. The appropriate Ohio EPA field office must be notified in writing of any transfer of this permit.
7. This source and any associated air pollution control system(s) shall be maintained regularly in accordance with good engineering practices in order to minimize air contaminant emissions. Any malfunction of this source or any associated air pollution control system(s) shall be reported immediately to the appropriate Ohio EPA field office in accordance with OAC rule 3745-15-06. Except as provided in that rule, any scheduled maintenance or malfunction necessitating the shutdown or bypassing of any air pollution control system(s) shall be accompanied by the shutdown of this source.
8. Any unauthorized or emergency release of an air contaminant from this source which, due to the toxic or hazardous nature of the material, may pose a threat to public health, or otherwise endanger the safety or welfare of the public, shall be reported immediately to the appropriate Ohio EPA field office (during normal business hours) or to the Ohio EPA's Emergency Response Group (1-800-282-9378). (Additional reporting may be required pursuant to the federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act.)

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Applicable State Regulations

The following rules of the Ohio Administrative Code establish the applicable emission limitation's and/or control requirements for this Ohio EPA Emission Unit:

3745-17-07
3745-17-08
3745-19-04
3745-31-05

(This condition in no way limits the applicability of other requirements of the Ohio Administrative Code to this Ohio EPA Emission Unit.)

In order to control emissions of fugitive dust, this facility will implement the following control measures:

2. This facility will apply water or suitable dust suppression chemicals as often as necessary on all unpaved roads and parking areas in order to minimize or prevent visible emissions of fugitive dust.
3. On unpaved roadways, speed zones of no more than 15 miles per hour will be established, posted and enforced by the owner or operator for all vehicles operating within the facility or facility-controlled access roads. On paved roadways a 25 miles per hour limit will be established.
4. This facility will operate and maintain a truck mounted spray system to distribute water and/or dust suppression solution in order to minimize or eliminate visible emissions of fugitive dust generated by vehicle traffic on unpaved roadways and parking areas.
5. Paved roadways will be maintained free of gross quantities of mud or dust to prevent tracking of materials onto public roadways and to minimize dust emissions from the facility roadways.
6. A new permanent facility entrance road will be in use by October 1, 1992. This permanent entrance will include at least 2700' of a paved roadway. Rumble strips and a wheel and undercarriage washing station will be installed on this new permanent road. The wheels and undercarriage of all vehicles exiting unpaved landfill roadways will be washed as necessary to eliminate the tracking of mud onto paved roadways. This requirement shall be waived when temperatures are below 32 degrees F.
7. If mud or dirt is deposited onto Gracemont Street, it will be cleaned off as soon as possible. At the end of each workday, Gracemont Street will be cleaned if needed.
8. Records will be maintained of when water or dust suppressants were applied to unpaved roads and when paved roads were cleaned. These records will be kept for a minimum of two years and must be made available for inspection by a member of this Agency during regular business hours.
9. Paved roads will not be swept when dry unless the fugitive dust generated by this operation is captured.

10. For unpaved roadways and parking areas, there will be no visible particulate emissions except for a period of time not to exceed three minutes during any sixty-minute observation period.
11. For paved roadways and parking areas, there will be no visible particulate emissions except for a period of time not to exceed one minute during any sixty-minute observation period.
12. Test Method twenty-two (22) as set forth in the "Appendix on Test Methods" in 40 CFR, Part 60, "Standards of Performance for new Stationary Sources" will be used to determine compliance with the visible particulate emissions of fugitive dust limits found in Terms and Conditions No. 10 and No. 11.
