This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. 2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The emission limitation required by this rule is less stringent than the emission limitation established pursuant to OAC rule 3745-31-05(A)(3).

B. Operational Restrictions

1. None

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall perform daily checks, when the emissions unit is in operation and when the weather conditions allow, for any visible emissions from the stack serving the unit. The presence or absence of any visible emissions shall be noted in an operations log. If visible emissions are observed, the permittee shall also note the following in the operations log:
 - a. the color of the emissions;
 - b. whether the emissions are representative of normal operations;
 - c. if the emissions are not representative of normal operations, the cause of the abnormal emissions;
 - d. the total duration of any visible emission incident; and,
 - e. any corrective actions taken to eliminate the visible emissions.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit semiannual written reports which (a) identify all days during which any visible emissions were observed from the stack serving the emissions unit and (b) describe any corrective actions taken to eliminate the visible emissions. These reports shall be submitted to the Director (the Ohio EPA Southeast District Office) by January 31 and July 31 of each year and shall cover the previous 6-month period.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the particulate matter emission limit of 1.7 pounds per hour or 0.0218 grain per dry standard cubic foot of exhaust gas shall be determined in accordance with OAC rule 3745-17-03. No testing is specifically required by this permit but, if appropriate, may be requested pursuant to OAC rule 3745-15-04(A).
2. Compliance with the applicable emission limit of 7.5 tons per year of particulate emissions shall be determined by multiplying the hourly emission rate by 8760 hours per year and by 0.0005 ton per pound.
3. If required, compliance with the applicable emission limit of 20% opacity as a 6-minute average shall be

determined in accordance with Method 9 as found in Appendix A of 40 CFR Part 60.
