You are hereby notified that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency has made a draft action recommending that the Director issue a Permit to Install for the air contaminant source(s) [emissions unit(s)] shown on the enclosed draft permit. This draft action is not an authorization to begin construction or modification of your emissions unit(s). The purpose of this draft is to solicit public comments on the proposed installation. A public notice concerning the draft permit will appear in the Ohio EPA Weekly Review and the newspaper in the county where the facility will be located. Public comments will be accepted by the field office within 30 days of the date of publication in the newspaper. Any comments you have on the draft permit should be directed to the appropriate field office within the comment period. A copy of your comments should also be mailed to Robert Hodanbosi, Division of Air Pollution Control, Ohio EPA, P.O. Box 1049, Columbus, OH, 43266-0149.

A Permit to Install may be issued in proposed or final form based on the draft action, any written public comments received within 30 days of the public notice, or record of a public meeting if one is held. You will be notified in writing of a scheduled public meeting. Upon issuance of a final Permit to Install a fee of **\$600** will be due. Please do not submit any payment now.

The Ohio EPA is urging companies to investigate pollution prevention and energy conservation. Not only will this reduce pollution and energy consumption, but it can also save you money. Part I - GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. Permit to Install General Terms and Conditions

1. Compliance Requirements

The emissions unit(s) identified in this Permit to Install shall remain in full compliance with all applicable State laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit.

2. Reporting Requirements Related to Monitoring and Recordkeeping Requirements

The permittee shall submit required reports in the following manner:

- a. Reports of any required monitoring and/or recordkeeping information shall be submitted to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency.
- b. Except as otherwise may be provided in the terms and conditions for a specific emissions unit, quarterly written reports of (a) any deviations (excursions) from emission limitations, operational restrictions, and control device operating parameter limitations that have been detected by the testing, monitoring, and recordkeeping requirements specified in this permit, (b) the probable cause of such deviations, and (c) any corrective actions or preventive measures which have been or will be taken, shall be submitted to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency. If no deviations occurred during a calendar quarter, the permittee shall submit a quarterly report, which states that no deviations occurred during that quarter. The reports shall be submitted quarterly, i.e., by January 31, April 30, July 31, and October 31 of each year and shall cover the previous calendar quarters. (These quarterly reports shall exclude deviations resulting from malfunctions reported in accordance with OAC rule 3745-15-06.)

3. Records Retention Requirements

Each record of any monitoring data, testing data, and support information required pursuant to this permit shall be retained for a period of five years from the date the record was created. Support information shall include, but not be limited to, all calibration and maintenance records and all original strip-chart recordings for continuous monitoring instrumentation, and copies of all reports required by this permit. Such records may be maintained in computerized form.

4. Inspections and Information Requests

The Director of the Ohio EPA, or an authorized representative of the Director, may, subject to the safety requirements of the permittee and without undue delay, enter upon the premises of this source at any reasonable time for purposes of making inspections, conducting tests, examining records or reports pertaining to any emission of air contaminants, and determining compliance with any applicable State air pollution laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit. The permittee shall furnish to the Director of the Ohio EPA, or an authorized representative of the Director, upon receipt of a written request and within a reasonable time, any

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information that may be requested to determine whether cause exists for modifying, reopening or revoking this permit or to determine compliance with this permit. Upon verbal or written request, the permittee shall also furnish to the Director of the Ohio EPA, or an authorized representative of the Director, copies of records required to be kept by this permit.

5. Scheduled Maintenance/Malfunction Reporting

Any scheduled maintenance of air pollution control equipment shall be performed in accordance with paragraph (A) of OAC rule 3745-15-06. The malfunction of any emissions units or any associated air pollution control system(s) shall be reported to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency in accordance with paragraph (B) of OAC rule 3745-15-06. Except as provided in that rule, any scheduled maintenance or malfunction necessitating the shutdown or bypassing of any air pollution control system(s) shall be accompanied by the shutdown of the emissions unit(s) that is (are) served by such control system(s).

6. Permit Transfers

Any transferee of this permit shall assume the responsibilities of the prior permit holder. The appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency must be notified in writing of any transfer of this permit.

7. Air Pollution Nuisance

The air contaminants emitted by the emissions units covered by this permit shall not cause a public nuisance, in violation of OAC rule 3745-15-07.

8. Termination of Permit to Install

This Permit to Install shall terminate within eighteen months of the effective date of the Permit to Install if the owner or operator has not undertaken a continuing program of installation or modification or has not entered into a binding contractual obligation to undertake and complete within a reasonable time a continuing program of installation or modification. This deadline may be extended by up to 12 months if application is made to the Director within a reasonable time before the termination date and the party shows good cause for any such extension.

9. Construction of New Sources(s)

The proposed emissions unit(s) shall be constructed in strict accordance with the plans and application submitted for this permit to the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency. There may be no deviation from the approved plans without the express, written approval of the Agency. Any deviations from the approved plans or the above conditions may

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lead to such sanctions and penalties as provided under Ohio law. Approval of these plans does not constitute an assurance that the proposed facilities will operate in compliance with all Ohio laws and regulations. Additional

facilities shall be installed upon orders of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency if the proposed sources are inadequate or cannot meet applicable standards.

If the construction of the proposed emissions unit(s) has already begun or has been completed prior to the date the Director of the Environmental Protection Agency approves the permit application and plans, the approval does not constitute expressed or implied assurance that the proposed facility has been constructed in accordance with the approved plans. The action of beginning and/or completing construction prior to obtaining the Director's approval constitutes a violation of OAC rule 3745-31-02. Furthermore, issuance of the Permit to Install does not constitute an assurance that the proposed source will operate in compliance with all Ohio laws and regulations. Approval of the plans in any case is not to be construed as an approval of the facility as constructed and/or completed. Moreover, issuance of the Permit to Install is not to be construed as a waiver of any rights that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (or other persons) may have against the applicant for starting construction prior to the effective date of the permit. Additional facilities shall be installed upon orders of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency if the proposed facilities prove to be inadequate or cannot meet applicable standards.

10. Public Disclosure

The facility is hereby notified that this permit, and all agency records concerning the operation of this permitted source, are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC rule 3745-49-03.

11. Applicability

This Permit to Install is applicable only to the emissions unit(s) identified in the Permit to Install. Separate application must be made to the Director for the installation or modification of any other emissions unit(s).

12. Best Available Technology

As specified in OAC Rule 3745-31-05, all new sources must employ Best Available Technology (BAT). Compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit will fulfill this requirement.

13. Source Operation and Operating Permit Requirements After Completion of Construction

This facility is permitted to operate each source described by this Permit to Install for a period of up to one year from the date the source commenced operation. This permission to operate is granted only if the facility complies with all requirements contained in this permit and all applicable air pollution laws, regulations, and policies. Pursuant to OAC Chapter 3745-35, the permittee shall submit a complete operating permit application within thirty (30) days after commencing operation of the emissions unit(s) covered by this permit.

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14. Construction Compliance Certification

The applicant shall provide Ohio EPA with a written certification (see enclosed form) that the facility has been constructed in accordance with the Permit to Install application and the terms and conditions of the Permit to Install. The certification shall be provided to Ohio EPA upon completion of construction but prior to startup of the source.

15. Fees

The permittee shall pay fees to the Director of the Ohio EPA in accordance with ORC section 3745.11 and OAC Chapter 3745-78. The permittee shall pay all applicable Permit to Install fees within 30 days after the issuance of this Permit to Install.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operations(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- 2.a None

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The facility shall be established as an area source with respect to 40 CFR 63 Subpart KK. Accordingly, the owner or operator agrees to comply with the following limits, which are found in 40 CFR 63.820(A)(2):
 - a. Use less than 9.1 Mg (10 tons) per each rolling 12-month period of each HAP at the facility, including materials used for source categories or purposes other than printing and

publishing, and

- b. Use less than 22.7 Mg (25 tons) per each rolling 12-month period of any combination of HAP at the facility, including materials used for source categories or purposes other than printing and publishing.
2. The following list of materials may be excluded from the conditions as stated in section B.1. of this permit: materials used in routine janitorial or facility grounds maintenance, personal uses by employees or other persons, the use of products for the purpose of maintaining electric, propane, gasoline and diesel powered motor vehicles operated by the facility, and the use of HAP contained in intake water (used for processing or noncontact cooling) or intake air (used either as compressed air or for combustion).
3. If either of the thresholds is exceeded as stated in section B.1. of this permit for any rolling 12-month period (without first obtaining and complying with other limits that keep its potential to emit HAP below major source levels), the permittee shall be considered in violation of its commitment for that 12-month period and shall be considered a major source of HAP beginning the first month after the end of the 12-month period in which either of the HAP use thresholds was exceeded. As a major source of HAP, this facility would be subject to the provisions of 40 CFR 63 Subpart KK as noted in paragraph (a)(1) of that section. This facility would no longer be eligible to use the provisions of 40 CFR 63.820(a)(2).

C. Monitoring and/or Recordkeeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each month for the K009 line:
 - a. The name and identification number of each coating and ink, as applied.
 - b. The VOC content of each coating and ink in percent VOC by volume of the volatile matter in the coating and ink, as applied [calculated in accordance with the equation specified in paragraph (B)(8) of OAC rule 3745-21-10 for $C_{VOC,6}$]. Also, if an owner or operator mixes complying coatings at a coating line, it is not necessary to record the VOC content of the resulting mixture as specified in OAC rule 3745-21-09 (B)(3)(f).
 - c. The VOC content of each coating and ink in percent VOC by weight of coating and ink, as applied [calculated in accordance with the equation specified in paragraph (B)(8) of OAC rule 3745-21-10 for $C_{VOC,7}$]. Also, if an owner or operator mixes complying coatings at a coating line, it is not necessary to record the VOC content of the resulting mixture as specified in OAC rule 3745-21-09 (B)(3)(f).
 - d. Pounds of purchased coatings for all Printing and Paperboard Cutting lines.

- e. Pounds of coatings and inks employed on K009 on a daily basis.
 - f. Application rates for adhesive (lbs/1000 cartons) on K009.
 - g. Number of cartons produced on the K009 line.
 - h. The hours of operation on the K009 line.
 - i. Calculate the weighted average percent VOC of the 15 most used inks/coatings (excluding adhesives) for all Printing and Paperboard Cutting lines on a monthly basis.
 - j. Calculate the 3-month rolling weighted average percent VOC of the 15 most used inks/coatings (excluding adhesives) for all Printing and Paperboard Cutting lines.
 - k. Calculate average lbs/hr of VOC emissions.
 - l. Calculate tpy of VOC emissions.
2. The facility shall maintain records of all required measurements and calculations needed to demonstrate compliance with section B.1. of this permit. Records maintained should include the mass of HAP containing materials used and mass fraction of HAP present in each HAP containing material used, on a monthly basis.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (Cleveland Bureau of Air Pollution Control) in writing of any monthly record showing the use of noncomplying coatings and inks. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director (Cleveland Bureau of Air Pollution Control) within 30 days following the end of the calendar month.
2. The permittee shall submit deviation (excursion) reports which identify all exceedances of the hourly emission limitation for VOC. This written report shall be submitted to the Director (Cleveland Bureau of Air Pollution Control) within 30 days of the occurrence of the deviation.
3. The permittee shall submit deviation (excursion) reports which identify all exceedances of the annual emission limitation for VOC. This written report shall be submitted to the Director (Cleveland Bureau of Air Pollution Control) within 30 days of the occurrence of the deviation.

1. Compliance with the emission limitation in Section A.1. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following method(s):

Emission Limitation:

VOC content of each coating and ink not to exceed 25 percent VOC by volume of the volatile matter of the coating and ink, as applied

Applicable Compliance Method: Compliance shall be based upon the record keeping requirements specified in Section C. In accordance with OAC rule 3745-21-04(B)(5), USEPA Method 24A shall be used to determine the VOC contents of the coatings and inks. If, pursuant to section 4.3 of Method 24, 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24A cannot be used for a particular coating or ink, the permittee shall so notify the Administrator of the USEPA and shall use formulation data for that coating or ink to demonstrate compliance until the USEPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision statements for Method 24A.

2. Emission Limitations:
the average volatile organic compound (VOC) emissions shall not exceed 2.39 lbs/hr

Applicable Compliance Method:

Compliance shall be demonstrated through recordkeeping from section C.1 and the equations below:

- a. **Inks/coatings used in 3 month rolling weighted average -**
lbs inks and coatings/month x 3-month rolling weighted average of percent VOC = lbs VOC emissions/month.
- b. **Material delivered directly to K009 -**
lbs inks and coatings/month x VOC content(s) (wt%) = lbs VOC emissions/month.
- c. **Adhesive -**
application rates (lbs adhesive/1000 cartons) x cartons produced/month x VOC content(s) (wt%) = lbs VOC emissions/month.

Apply the above equations each month and then sum the emissions to obtain a total lbs VOC emissions/month and divide by number of hours of operation per month.

volatile organic compound (VOC) emissions shall not exceed 10.47 tons per year

Compliance shall be demonstrated through recordkeeping from section C.1 and the equations below:

- b. **Material delivered directly to K009 -**
lbs inks and coatings/month x VOC content(s) (wt%) = lbs VOC emissions/month.

application rates (lbs adhesive/1000 cartons) x cartons produced/month x VOC content(s) (wt%) = lbs VOC emissions/month.

Apply the above equations each month and then sum the emissions to obtain a total lbs VOC emissions/month. Sum 12-consecutive *total lbs VOC emissions/month* to obtain a rolling, 12-month summation, and divide by 2000 lbs. After the first 12-months, each new month will constitute a new 12-month summation.

1. Modeling to demonstrate compliance with the Ohio EPA's "Air Toxic Policy" was not necessary because the emissions unit's maximum annual emissions for each toxic compound will be less than 1.0 ton. OAC Chapter 3745-31 requires permittees to apply for and obtain a new or modified permit to install prior to making a "modification" as defined by OAC rule 3745-31-01. The permittee is hereby advised that changes in the composition of the materials, or use of new materials, that would cause the emissions of any pollutant that has a listed TLV to increase to above 1.0 ton per year may require the permittee to apply for and obtain a new permit to install.
