This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. 2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The 0.9 lb/hr and 21.6 lbs/day limits were established for PTI purposes to reflect the potential to emit for the emissions unit using 1095 gallons of cleanup per year. Therefore, it is not necessary to develop record keeping and reporting requirements to ensure compliance with these limits

B. Operational Restrictions

1. None

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each month:
 - a. the company identification of the cleanup material;
 - b. the number of gallons of cleanup materials employed;
 - c. the VOC content of the cleanup material, in pounds per gallon; and,
 - d. the total VOC emission rate in tons.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit deviation (excursion) reports which identify each month during which the total VOC emission rate exceeded 0.3 ton/month, and the actual VOC emission rate for that month.

A copy of such records shall be sent to the Director (appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) within 30 days after the exceedance occurs.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitation(s) in Section A.1. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following method(s):
 - Emission Limitation - 0.9 lb/hr organic compounds
 - Applicable Compliance Method - Compliance shall be determined by multiplying the maximum hourly usage rate for the emission unit by the maximum VOC content of the cleanup employed in this emissions unit.
 - Emission Limitation - 21.6 lbs/day organic compounds
 - Applicable Compliance Method - Compliance shall be determined by multiplying the maximum daily usage rate for the emission unit by the maximum VOC content of the cleanup employed in this emissions unit.
 - Emission Limitation - 0.3 ton/month organic compounds

Applicable Compliance Method -

Compliance shall be based upon the record keeping requirements specified in Section C.1.

Emission Limitation -

4.0 TPY

Applicable Compliance Method -

Compliance shall be based upon the record keeping requirements specified in Section C.1. and shall be the sum of the 12 monthly OC emission rates for the calendar year.

1. The permittee is hereby notified that this permit and all agency records concerning the operation of this permittee emissions unit are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC rule 3745-49-03.
