This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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**Part II - Special Terms and Conditions**

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

**A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements**

1. **B. Operational Restrictions**

1. The temperature of the exhaust gases from the secondary chamber shall be maintained at 1400 degrees Fahrenheit or greater during each burn off cycle.

**C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements**

1. The permittee shall operate and maintain a continuous temperature monitor and recorder which measures and records the temperature, in degrees Fahrenheit, of the exhaust gases from the secondary combustion chamber when the emissions unit is in operation. The temperature monitor and recorder shall be installed, calibrated, operated and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, instructions and operating manuals. The monitoring and recording devices shall be capable of accurately measuring the desired parameter.
2. The permittee shall maintain a log of all periods of time when the emissions unit is in operation and the secondary combustion chamber temperature was less than 1400 degrees Fahrenheit.

**D. Reporting Requirements**

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) in writing of any record of a secondary combustion chamber temperature below 1400 degrees Fahrenheit, as well as the corrective action(s) taken. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be submitted to the Director within 45 days after the deviation occurs.

**E. Testing Requirements**

1. Compliance with the emission limitation(s) in Section A.1. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following method(s):
  - Emission Limitation -  
0.10 pound particulates/100 pounds salvageable material charged
  - Applicable Compliance Method -  
If required, compliance with this mass emission limitation shall be based on stack testing per OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(8).
  - Emission Limitation -  
1.75 tons/yr particulates
  - Applicable Compliance Method -  
This limit is based on the maximum rated capacity of the emissions unit (400 pounds of salvageable

material/hour) times the allowable emission limit of 0.10 pound particulate matter/100 pounds salvageable material charged and the maximum operating schedule of 8760 hours per year, divided by 2,000 pounds/ton. Compliance with this annual allowable emission rate is demonstrated through a demonstration of compliance with the allowable emission limit of 0.10 lb particulate matter/100 lbs salvageable material charged (see E.1.a.) and the monitoring and record keeping requirements of Section C.1.

Emission Limitation -  
5% opacity, as a 6-minute average

Applicable Compliance Method -  
Compliance shall be determined by visible emission evaluations performed in accordance with procedures specified in USEPA Reference Method 9 (40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A).

**F. Miscellaneous Requirements**

1. The permittee is hereby notified that this permit, and all agency records concerning the operation of the permitted emissions unit are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC rule 3745-49-03.
