This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**
 - (b) In accordance with the synthetic minor Title V PTI 08-04293 issued 06/11/2002 the emissions of Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs), as identified in Section 112(b) of Title III of the Clean Air Act, from this facility shall be less than 9.9 TPY for any single HAP and 24.9 TPY for any combination of HAPs, based on rolling, 12-month summations.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each day for the coating line:
 - a. The name and identification number of each coating employed.
 - b. The volume, in gallons, of each coating employed.
 - c. The total volume, in gallons, of all of the coatings employed.
2. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each month for this emission unit:
 - a. the name and identification number of each coating, as applied;
 - b. the individual HAP* content for each HAP of each coating in pounds of individual HAP per gallon of coating, as applied;
 - c. the total combined HAP content for each HAP of each coating in pounds of combined HAPs per gallon of coating, as applied (sum of all individual HAP contents from b);
 - d. the number of gallons of each coating employed;
 - e. the name and identification of each cleanup material employed;
 - f. the individual HAP content for each HAP of each cleanup material in pounds of individual HAP per gallon cleanup material, as applied;
 - g. the total combined HAP content of each cleanup material in pounds of combined HAPs per gallon of cleanup material, as applied (sum of all individual HAP contents from f);

h. the number of gallons of each cleanup material employed;

i. the total individual HAP emissions for each HAP from all coating and cleanup material in pounds or tons per rolling, 12-month period (for each HAP the sum of b times d for each coating and the sum of f times h for each cleanup material); and

j. the total combined HAP emissions from all coating and cleanup materials employed, in pounds or tons per month and pounds or tons per rolling, 12-month period (the sum of c times d for each coating plus the sum of g times h for each cleanup material).

* A listing of the HAPs can be found in Section 112(b) of the Clean Air Act or can be obtained by contacting your Ohio EPA field office or local air agency contact. Material Safety Data Sheets typically include a listing of the solvents contained in the coatings or clean materials. This information does not have to be kept on a line-by-line basis.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) in writing of any daily record showing that the coating line employs more than the applicable maximum daily coating usage limit. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) within 45 days after the exceedance occurs.
2. The permittee shall submit quarterly deviation (excursion) reports which identify all exceedances of the following:
 - a. An identification of each month during which the rolling, 12-month individual facility HAP emission rate exceeded the 9.9 TPY rolling, 12-month individual facility HAP emission limitation, and the actual rolling, 12-month individual facility HAP emission rate for each such month.
 - b. An identification of each month during which the rolling, 12-month combined facility HAP emission rate exceeded the 24.9 TPY rolling, 12-month combined facility HAP emission limitation, and the actual rolling, 12-month combined facility HAP emission rate for each such month.
3. These quarterly deviation (excursion) reports shall be submitted to the Ohio EPA Central District Office or local air agency by January 31, April 30, July 31 and October 31 of each year and shall cover the previous calendar quarter. If no deviations occurred during a calendar quarter, the permittee shall submit a report which states that no deviations occurred during the calendar quarter.
4. The permittee shall submit annual reports which specify the individual and/or combined HAP emissions from this emissions unit for the previous calendar year. The reports shall be submitted by April 15 of each year. This reporting requirement may be satisfied by including and identifying the specific emission data from this emissions unit in the annual Fee Emission Report.
5. The permittee shall submit annual reports which specify the individual and/or combined HAP emissions from the entire facility for the previous calendar year. The reports shall be submitted by April 15 of each year. This reporting requirement may be satisfied by including and identifying the specific emission data from this emissions unit in the annual Fee Emission Report.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance Method

Compliance with the emission limitations in Section A.1. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:

Emission Limitation -

Less than or equal to 8 gallons coating usage per day

Applicable Compliance Method -

Compliance shall be based upon the record keeping requirements specified in Section C.1.

Emission Limitation -

9.9 TPY of an individual HAP, based on a 12-month rolling summation

Applicable Compliance Method -

Compliance shall be based upon the record keeping requirements specified in Sections C.2.

Emission Limitation -

24.9 TPY of any combination of HAPs, based on a 12-month rolling summation

Applicable Compliance Method -

Compliance shall be based upon the record keeping requirements specified in Sections C.2.
