This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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**Part II - Special Terms and Conditions**

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

**A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements**

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**
  - (a) \* The emissions limit based on these rules are less stringent than the limit established pursuant to OAC rule 3745-31-05.

**B. Operational Restrictions**

1. This emission unit shall be covered when not in use.
2. The volatile organic compound (VOC) content of the coatings employed in this emission unit shall not exceed 2.0 pounds per gallon, less water, applied.

**C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements**

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each month for this emissions unit:
  - a. The name and identification number of each coating, as applied.
  - b. The VOC content of each coating (excluding water and exempt solvents), as applied.
  - c. The number of gallons (excluding water and exempt solvents) of each coating employed.
  - d. The total VOC emissions from all coatings employed, in pounds or tons per month.

**D. Reporting Requirements**

1. In accordance with paragraph 3 of the General Terms and Conditions, the permittee shall submit deviation (excursion) reports which identify each month during which the volatile organic compound emission rate from the coating materials exceeded 0.56 ton and the actual volatile organic compound emission rate for each such month.
2. The permittee shall notify the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) in writing of any monthly record showing the use of noncomplying coatings. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) within 30 days following the end of the month.

**E. Testing Requirements**

1. Compliance with the emission limitation(s) in Section A.I. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following method(s):
 

Emission Limitation-  
0.56 ton/month VOC, less water and exempt solvents

Applicable Compliance Method-  
Compliance shall be based upon the record keeping requirements as specified in Section C.1.

Emission Limitation-  
6.68 TPY VOC, less water and exempt solvents

**Applicable Compliance Method-**

Compliance shall be based upon the record keeping requirements in Section C.1. and shall be the sum of the twelve monthly VOC emission rates for the calendar year.

**Emission Limitation-**

2.0 lbs VOC/gallon coating, less water and exempt solvents

**Applicable Compliance Method-**

USEPA Method 24 shall be used to determine the VOC contents for coatings. If, pursuant to section 4.3 of method 24, 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24 cannot be used for a particular coating, the permittee shall so notify the Administrator of the USEPA and shall use formulation data for that coating to demonstrate compliance until the USEPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision statements for Method 24.

**F. Miscellaneous Requirements**

1. The permittee is hereby notified that this permit, and all agency records concerning the operation of this permitted emissions unit are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC rule 3745-49-03.
2. The permittee shall comply with any applicable State and federal requirements governing the storage, treatment, and disposal of any waste material generated by the operation of the emissions unit.
3. The following terms and conditions shall supersede all air pollution control requirements for this emissions unit contained in permit to install 08-3588, as issued on November 6, 1996: A, B, C, D, and, F.1.
