This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.
 - (a) None.
2. For the purpose of a permit-to-operate document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are enforceable under state law only with the exception of those listed below which are federally enforceable.
 - (a) None.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The 6.2 lbs/hr and 49.6 lbs/day limits were established for PTI purposes to reflect the potential to emit for this emissions unit. Therefore, it is not necessary to develop record keeping and/or reporting requirements to ensure compliance with these limits.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The maximum daily coating usage for this emission unit shall not exceed 8 gallons.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each day for the coating line:
 - (a) The name and identification number of each coating employed.
 - (b) The VOC content of each coating, as applied, in pounds per gallon.
 - (c) The volume, in gallons, of each coating employed.
 - (d) The total volume, in gallons, of all of the coatings employed.
2. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each month:
 - (a) The name and identification of each cleanup material employed.
 - (b) The number of gallons of each cleanup material employed.
 - (c) The VOC content of each cleanup material, in pounds per gallon.
 - (d) The total VOC emissions from all coatings and cleanup materials employed, in pounds or tons per month.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director in writing of any daily record showing that the coating line employs more than the applicable maximum daily coating usage limit. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director within 45 days after the exceedance occurs.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitation(s) in section A.1. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following method(s):
 - Emission Limitation - 6.2 lbs/hr, excluding cleanup
 - Applicable Compliance Method -

Compliance shall be determined by multiplying the maximum hourly coating usage of one gallon times the maximum VOC content of any coating employed in this emissions unit. (This is how the 6.2 lbs/hr limitation was developed for the PTI.)

Emission Limitation -
49.6 lbs/day, excluding cleanup

Applicable Compliance Method -

Compliance shall be determined by multiplying the maximum daily coating usage of 8 gallons times the maximum VOC content of any coating employed in this emissions unit. (This is how the 49.6 lbs/day limitation was developed for the PTI.) Compliance can also be based upon the record keeping specified in (C) (1).

Emission Limitation -
7.34 tons/yr of VOCs, including cleanup

Applicable Compliance Method -

Compliance shall be based upon the record keeping specified in (C) (1) &(2) and shall be the sum of the 12 monthly VOC emission rates for the calendar year.

2. USEPA Method 24 shall be used to determine the VOC contents for coatings. If, pursuant to section 4.3 of method 24, 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24 cannot be used for a particular coating, the permittee shall so notify the Administrator of the USEPA and shall use formulation data for that coating to demonstrate compliance until the USEPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision statements for Method 24.

F. **Miscellaneous Requirements**

1. The facility is hereby notified that this permit, and all agency records concerning the operation of this permitted emissions unit are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC rule 3745-49-03.
2. The owner/operator shall comply with any applicable state and federal requirements governing the storage, treatment, transport, and disposal of any waste material generated by the operation of the emissions unit.
