This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The 58.9 lbs/day limit was established for PTI purposes to reflect the potential to emit for this emissions unit. Therefore, it is not necessary to develop record keeping and /or reporting requirements to ensure compliance with this limit.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The maximum daily coating usage for this emissions unit shall not exceed 8 gallons.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. This facility shall collect and record the following information each day for the coating line:
 - (a) The name and identification of each coating employed.
 - (b) The volume, in gallons, of each coating employed.
 - (c) The total volume, in gallons, of all of the coatings employed.
 - (d) The total organic compound emission rate for all coatings, in pounds.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. This facility shall notify the Director (appropriate District Office or local air agency) in writing of any daily record showing that the coating line employs more than the applicable maximum daily coating usage limit and the corrective actions taken. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the RAPCA within 45 days after the exceedance occurs.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitation(s) in Section A.1. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following method(s):

Emission Limitation:
58.9 lbs/day

Applicable Compliance Method -
Compliance shall be determined by multiplying the maximum daily coating usage of 8 gallons times the maximum VOC content of any coating employed in this emissions unit. (This is how the 58.9 lbs/day limitation was developed for the PTI.) Compliance can also be based upon the record keeping specified in C.1.

Emission Limitation:
5.88 TPY

Applicable Compliance Method -
Compliance shall be based upon the record keeping specified in C.1 and shall be the sum of the daily VOC emission rates for the calendar year.
2. Formulation data or USEPA Method 24 shall be used to determine the organic compound contents of the

coatings.

F. **Miscellaneous Requirements**

1. The owner/operator shall comply with any applicable state and federal requirements governing the storage, treatment, transport, and disposal of any waste material generated by the operation of the source(s).
2. The facility is hereby notified that this permit, and all agency records concerning the operation of this permitted source are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC rule 3745-49-03.
