This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The permittee shall operate and maintain a cyclone separator at all times during which the emissions unit is in operation.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

D. Reporting Requirements

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitation(s) in Section A.1. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following method(s):
 - Emission Limitation - 0.82 lb/hr particulate matter allowable emission rate
 - Applicable Compliance Method - Compliance was initially demonstrated through previous emission testing. Ongoing compliance shall be demonstrated by complying with the 5% opacity visible emission limit.
 - Emission Limitation - 3.60 TPY particulate matter
 - Applicable Compliance Method - This limit is based upon the allowable hourly emission limitation at a maximum operating schedule of 8760 hours per year (24 hrs/day, 365 days/yr). Compliance with this annual emission limit shall, therefore, be determined by compliance with the 5% opacity visible emission limitation.
 - Emission Limitation - 5% opacity visible emission limit
 - Applicable Compliance Method - Compliance shall be determined by visible emission evaluations performed in accordance with OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(5) using the methods and procedures specified in USEPA Reference Method 9.

F. Miscellaneous Requirements

1. This facility is hereby notified that this permit, and all agency records concerning the operation of this permitted emissions unit are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC rule 3745-49-03.
2. This facility shall implement and maintain a Preventive Maintenance and Malfunction Abatement Plan (PM&MAP) for this emissions unit and the associated emission control system.
