Enclosed please find a modification to the Ohio EPA Permit to Install referenced above which will modify the terms and conditions.



WASTE DISPOSAL

The owner/operator shall comply with any applicable state and federal requirements governing the storage, treatment, transport, and disposal of any waste material generated by the operation of the sources.

MAINTENANCE OF EQUIPMENT

This source and its associated air pollution control system(s) shall be maintained regularly in accordance with good engineering practices and the recommendations of the respective manufacturers in order to minimize air contaminant emissions.

MALFUNCTION/ABATEMENT

In accordance with OAC Rule 3745-15-06, any malfunction of the source(s) or associated air pollution control system(s) shall be reported immediately to the North Ohio Valley Air Authority, 814 Adams, Steubenville, OH 43952.

As a standby system, Dockside, Inc. shall maintain and employ a three side concrete receiving pad for trucks to dump loads of cleaned wet coal in a manner that will minimize and eliminate fugitive dust.

4. Transfer Conveying

In accordance with the requirements of OAC Rule 3745-17-08 and OAC Rule 3745-31-05, Dockside, Inc. shall maintain and employ totally enclosed transfer points and covered conveyors for the handling of damp coal in a manner that will minimize and eliminate fugitive dust.

5. Load Out

In accordance with the requirements of OAC Rule 3745-17-08 and OAC Rule 3745-31-05, Dockside, Inc. shall maintain and employ a telescopic chute on the covered conveyor barge coal loading chute in a manner that will reduce the free fall distance sufficiently to minimize and eliminate fugitive dust. As a standby system, Dockside, Inc. shall employ a crane operated clam shell bucket that seals completely and will not spill coal during transfer. During barge loading, the clam shell bucket shall be opened only when the bucket has been lowered sufficiently to minimize and eliminate fugitive dust.

6. Barge Unloading/Truck Loading

In accordance with the requirements of OAC Rules 3745-17-08(B) and 3745-31-05, Dockside, Inc. shall maintain and employ a crane operated clam shell bucket that seals completely and shall not spill coal from the bucket during transfer. The clam shell bucket shall be lowered into the bed of the trailer sufficiently to reduce the drop height to the extent possible in order to minimize the free fall distance. All coal unloaded shall possess sufficient moisture content to minimize and eliminate fugitive dust during bucket unloading. All loaded trucks leaving the plant property shall be tarped in order to minimize load loss.
