This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. B. Operational Restrictions

1. The pressure drop across the baghouse shall be maintained within the range of 4-6 inches of water while the emissions unit is in operation.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall properly install, operate, and maintain equipment to monitor the pressure drop across the baghouse while the emissions unit is in operation. The monitoring equipment shall be installed, calibrated, operated, and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, instructions, and operating manual(s). The permittee shall record the pressure drop across the baghouse on a daily basis while the emissions unit is in operation.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit pressure drop deviation (excursion) reports that identify all periods of time during which the pressure drop across the baghouse did not comply with the allowable range specified above.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the allowable emission limitations in Section A.1 of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:
Emission Limitation:
2.08 lbs/hr Particulate emissions

Applicable Compliance Method:
If required, the permittee shall demonstrate compliance with the hourly emission limitation through emission testing performed in accordance with Methods 1-5 of 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A.

Emission Limitation:

Visible Emissions shall not equal or exceed five percent opacity as a six minute average.

Applicable Compliance Method:

If required, compliance shall be determined through visible emission observations in accordance with Method 9 of 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A.

Emission Limitation:

8 lbs/hr and 40 lbs/day VOC emissions

Applicable Compliance Method:

Compliance with the hourly emission limitation is based upon the maximum emissions rate of 0.75 lbs/hr. Therefore, no hourly records are required to demonstrate compliance with this limit.

As long as compliance is maintained with the hourly emission limitation, compliance with the daily emission limitation will be shown (the daily emission limitation was calculated by multiplying the maximum emission rate of 0.75 lbs/hr by the maximum operating schedule of 24 hrs/day).

If required, the permittee shall demonstrate compliance with the hourly emission limitation through emission testing performed in accordance with Methods 25 or 25A of 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A.
