
Dear Sir:

The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. It must be filed with the Environmental Board of Review within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. A copy of the appeal must be served on the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and the Environmental Law Division of the Office of the Attorney General within three (3) days of filing with the Board. 

The above named entity is hereby granted a permit to install for the above described source(s) pursuant to Chapter 3745-31 of the Ohio Administrative Code. Issuance of this permit does not constitute expressed or implied approval or agreement that, if constructed or modified in accordance with the plans included in the application, the above described source(s) of environmental pollutants will operate in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and regulations, and does not constitute expressed or implied assurance that if constructed or modified in accordance with those plans and specifications, the above described source(s) of pollutants will be granted the necessary permits to operate (air) or NPDES permits as applicable.

This permit is granted subject to the conditions attached hereto.

Substantial construction for installation must take place within eighteen months of the effective date of this permit. This deadline may be extended by up to twelve months, if application is made to the Director no less than sixty days before the expiration of this permit and the party shows good cause for any such extension.

The Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, or his authorized representatives, may enter upon the premises of the above named applicant during construction and operation at any reasonable time for the purpose of making inspections, conducting tests, examining records or reports pertaining to the construction, modification or installation of the above described source of environmental pollutants.

The proposed source shall be constructed in strict accordance with the plans and application submitted for this permit to the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency. There may be no deviation from the approved plans without the express, written approval of the Agency. Any deviations from the approved plans or the above conditions may lead to such sanctions and penalties as provided under Ohio law. Approval of these plans does not constitute an assurance that the proposed facilities will operate in compliance with all Ohio laws and regulations. Additional facilities shall be installed upon orders of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency if the proposed sources are inadequate or cannot meet applicable standards.

The specified permit fee must be remitted within 15 days of the effective date of this permit to install.

This permit shall apply only to the source(s) shown on the application approved by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

The appropriate District Office of the Ohio EPA or Local Air Pollution Control Agency shall be notified, in writing as to (a) the construction starting date (b) the construction completion date and (c) the date the facilities were placed into operation.

The facility shall not discharge digester gas into the ambient air. All digester gas shall either be burned in the wastewater treatment plant boiler or the waste gas burner.

This permit applies only to the proposed sanitary sewers and sewage treatment facilities. All other aspects of the proposed projects must be approved by the Ohio Department of Health and/or the local health department.

This permit applies to treatment facilities designed to serve an average daily hydraulic flow of no more than 1.4 M gallons.

Roof drains, foundation drains and other clean water connections to the sanitary sewers shall be prohibited in accordance with legally adopted rules regulating the use of sanitary sewers.

No liquids, sludges, or toxic or hazardous wastes other than those set forth in the approved specifications and plans shall be accepted for disposal without the written approval of the Agency.

Sewer and manhole construction and joints shall conform to standards of this department.

When Polyvinyl Chloride pipe is used, it must be tested for maximum deflection of 5% under the supervision of a registered Professional Engineer at a time when he has determined that the backfill has settled. Results of these tests should be submitted to the appropriate district office. Any lines which fail the test must be repaired and retested until they meet the requirements.

Construction of any wastewater treatment facilities shall be completed and ready for approved operation before sewage or other wastewater is discharged to the facilities.

A Report, which provides a technical appraisal of the normal operating conditions of the new facilities shall be submitted to the appropriate District Office of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency no later than three months after the new facilities are placed into operation.

Daily records of operation shall be maintained and submitted to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency at the end of each month.

The owner shall be responsible for the proper operation and maintenance of the wastewater treatment facilities.

The operation of the wastewater treatment facilities shall be under the responsible charge of a certified operator having the proper certificate issued under Chapter 3745-7-05 of the Ohio Administrative Code (former Ohio EPA Regulation HE-37-05).

Provisions shall be made for proper operation of the wastewater pumping facilities.
