A copy of the appeal must be served on the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and the Environmental Law Division of the Office of the Attorney General within three (3) days of filing with the Board. 

The above named entity is hereby granted a permit to install for the above described source(s) pursuant to Chapter 3745-31 of the Ohio Administrative Code. Issuance of this permit does not constitute expressed or implied approval or agreement that, if constructed or modified in accordance with the plans included in the application, the above described source(s) of environmental pollutants will operate in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and regulations, and does not constitute expressed or implied assurance that if constructed or modified in accordance with those plans and specifications, the above described source(s) of pollutants will be granted the necessary permits to operate (air) or NPDES permits as applicable.

This permit is granted subject to the conditions attached hereto.

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Substantial construction for installation must take place within eighteen months of the effective date of this permit. This deadline may be extended by up to twelve months, if application is made to the Director no less than sixty days before the expiration of this permit and the party shows good cause for any such extension.

The Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, or his authorized representatives, may enter upon the premises of the above named applicant during construction and operation at any reasonable time for the purpose of making inspections, conducting tests, examining records or reports pertaining to the construction, modification or installation of the above described source of environmental pollutants.

If the construction of the proposed source has already begun or has been completed prior to the date the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency approves the permit application and plans, the approval does not constitute expressed or implied assurance that the proposed facility has been constructed in accordance with the approved plans. The action of beginning and/or completing construction prior to obtaining the Director's approval constitutes a violation of OAC Rule 3745-31-02. Furthermore, issuance of the Permit to Install does not constitute an assurance that the proposed source will operate in compliance with all Ohio laws and regulations. Approval of the plans in any case is not to be construed as an approval of the facility as constructed and/or completed. Moreover, issuance of the Permit to Install is not to be construed as a waiver of any rights that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (or other persons) may have against the applicant for starting construction prior to the effective date of the permit. Additional facilities shall be installed upon orders of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency if the proposed facilities prove to be inadequate or cannot meet applicable standards.

The specified permit fee must be remitted within 15 days of the effective date of this permit to install.

This permit shall apply only to the source(s) shown on the application approved by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

Applicable Rules:

The specific operation(s), equipment and/or property which constitute the air contaminant source and which are covered by this permit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rule(s) of the Ohio Administrative Code:

Allowable mass emission limitation(s) and/or control requirements:

The allowable mass emission limitation(s) and /or control requirements for the operation(s), equipment and/or property identified above are specified in the following table:

Operation(s), Equipment and/or Property	Allowable Mass Emission Limitation(s) and/or Control Requirements
Plant Roadways & Parking Areas	Paved surfaces shall be swept and flushed with water at least twice per week and unpaved surfaces shall be periodically oiled and watered at least twice per day during periods of dry weather to minimize or eliminate visible emissions of fugitive dust when the facility is in operation.
Material Handling	All three sided hoppers, covered conveyors, enclosed transfer points and telescoping chutes shall be maintained and utilized in such a manner so as to minimize or eliminate visible emissions of fugitive dust during all barge and truck loading or unloading and material conveying and transferring operations.

Storage Piles

Telescoping chutes shall be maintained and utilized on all stock-piling operations to minimize or eliminate visible emissions of fugitive dust.

The salt stockpiles shall be covered at all times when not in use.

Sand shall be stored in elevated, gravity fed storage bins (silos).

If any of the control requirements contained herein prove to be ineffective in minimizing or eliminating visible emissions of fugitive dust, additional requirements will be imposed.

Air pollution control equipment maintenance/malfunction/  
reporting:

This source and its associated air pollution control system(s) shall be maintained regularly in accordance with good engineering practices and the recommendations of the respective manufacturers in order to minimize air contaminant emissions.

Any malfunction of this source or its associated air pollution control system(s) shall be reported immediately to the Ohio EPA field office in accordance with OAC rule 3745-15-06.

Except as provided by OAC rule 3745-15-06, any scheduled maintenance or malfunction necessitating the shutdown or bypassing of the air pollution control equipment shall be accompanied by the shutdown of this source.

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This Permit to Install is applicable only to the installation and/or modification of the following air contaminant sources, wastewater disposal systems and solid waste disposal facilities:

Air Contaminant Sources: Plant Roadways and Parking Areas  
Material Handling Facilities  
Storage Piles

Wastewater Disposal Systems: Wastewater (Runoff) Treatment  
Facilities

Solid Waste Disposal Facilities: None

Roof drains, foundation drains, and other clean water connections to the disposal system are prohibited.

No liquids, sludges, or toxic or hazardous wastes other than those set forth in the approved permit shall be accepted for disposal without the written approval of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency.

Dock Side, Inc. shall install approved rain covers over all salt piles within 30 days of the effective date of the permit.

Dock Side, Inc. shall install all other proposed facilities within 45 days of the effective date of the permit.

The appropriate District Office of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency shall be notified, in writing prior to the start of construction, as to (a) the construction starting date (b) the construction completion date and (c) the date the wastewater disposal system was placed into operation.

The owner shall be responsible for the proper operation and maintenance of the wastewater disposal system.
