This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

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The daily VOC emissions limit is based on the emissions unit's PTE. Therefore, no daily records are required to demonstrate compliance with this limit.

The annual VOC emissions limit is based on the VOC content limits and usage limits. Therefore, compliance with the VOC content limits and usage limits shall constitute compliance with the annual VOC emissions limit.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The VOC content of each coating employed shall not exceed 6.85 lbs/gallon, as-applied, including water and exempt solvents.
The VOC content of the cleanup material employed shall not exceed 7.4 lbs/gallon.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The use of coatings shall not exceed 375 gallons per year, as-applied, including water and exempt solvents.
2. The use of cleanup materials shall not exceed 60 gallons per year.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain monthly records of the following:
 - a. the name and identification number of each coating and cleanup material employed;
 - b. the total gallons of all coatings and all cleanup materials employed; and
 - c. the VOC content of each coating (including water and exempt solvents) and cleanup material employed, as applied.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Hamilton County Department of Environmental Services in writing of any monthly record which shows an exceedance of the VOC content limits. This notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Hamilton County Department of Environmental Services within thirty days after the exceedance occurs.
2. The permittee shall also submit annual reports of the total coating and cleanup material usages for the previous calendar year. These reports shall be submitted by January 31 of each year.

E. Testing Requirements

1. USEPA Method 24 shall be used to determine the VOC content for each coating employed. If, pursuant to section

- 4.3 of Method 24, 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24 cannot be used for a particular coating, the permittee shall so notify the Administrator of the USEPA and shall use formulation data for that coating to demonstrate compliance until the USEPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision statements for Method 24.
 2. Formulation data or USEPA Method 24 shall be used to determine the VOC content of each cleanup material employed.
 3. Compliance with the VOC content limits shall be demonstrated by the record keeping requirements in C.1.
 4. Compliance with the usage limits shall be demonstrated by the sum of the monthly records in C.1.
