This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

B. Operational Restrictions

1. Material throughput shall not exceed 40,000 lbs/hr, 178,000 lbs/day and 85,008,000 lbs/yr.
2. The throughput of the following listed products shall not exceed the following:

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain daily records of the following:
 - a. the product name;
 - b. the amount of each product processed, in pounds;
 - c. the amount of each product processed in gallons;
 - d. the vapor pressure of each product, in psia;
 - e. the VOC content of each product, in pounds per gallon;
 - f. the total amount of all products, in pounds;
 - g. the total VOC emissions, in pounds*.

* Emissions shall be determined by using the methods outlined in the PTI application 14-2022 submitted 12/17/90.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Hamilton County Department of Environmental Services in writing of any daily record showing an exceedance of the usage limitations as outlined in this permit. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Hamilton County Department of Environmental Services within 30 days following the end of the calendar month.
2. The permittee shall submit semiannual reports that summarize the information as outlined in term C. These reports shall be submitted by February 15 and August 15 of each calendar year and shall cover the previous six calendar months.

E. Testing Requirements

1. USEPA methods 24 and 24A shall be used to determine the VOC content for all materials outlined in this permit. If, pursuant to section 4.3 of Method 24, 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24 or 24A cannot be used for a particular material, the permittee shall so notify the Administrator of the USEPA and shall use formulation data for that material to demonstrate compliance until the USEPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision statements for Method 24 or 24A.
2. Compliance with the usage and emission limitations shall be demonstrated by term C.
