This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) Organic compound (OC) emissions from all coatings employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 0.82 lb/hr.
OC emissions from all coatings and cleanup materials employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 32 lbs/day and 5.07 TPY.
Visible particulate emissions shall not exceed 20 percent opacity, as a six-minute average, except as specified by rule.
The OC content of each coating employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 5.86 lbs/gal., as applied, excluding water and exempt solvents.
The OC content of each cleanup material employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 8.57 lbs/gal, as applied.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. Coating usage for this emissions unit shall not exceed 3.4 gallons/day and 1000 gallons/year.
2. Cleanup material usage for this emissions unit shall not exceed 1.4 gallons/day and 500 gallons/year.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain monthly records of the following:
 - a. The company identification for each coating and cleanup material employed.
 - b. The number of gallons of each coating and cleanup material employed.
 - c. The OC content of each coating and cleanup material, as applied, in pounds per gallon.
 - d. The OC emissions for each coating and cleanup material, i.e., (b)(c), in pounds.
 - e. The total OC emissions for all coatings and cleanup materials, i.e., the sum of (d) for all coatings and cleanup materials, in pounds.
 - f. The total number of days the emissions unit was in operation.
 - g. The average daily OC emissions for all coatings and cleanup materials, i.e., (e)/(f), in pounds per day (average).

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit a copy of any monthly record which shows an exceedance of the coating and cleanup material OC content limits or the daily OC emission limit. A copy of each such record shall be submitted within 45 days of the exceedance.
2. The permittee shall also submit an annual report which summarizes the coating and cleanup material usages and

the total OC emissions from this emissions unit. This report shall be submitted by February 15th of each calendar year.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the OC content limitation shall be demonstrated by formulation data, or USEPA method 24 (for coatings) or 24A (for flexographic and rotogravure printing inks and related coatings) shall be used to determine the OC contents of the inks and coatings.
2. Compliance with the daily OC emission limit shall be demonstrated by the recordkeeping requirements of section C.1. of this permit.
3. Compliance with OAC 3745-17-07(A) shall be demonstrated by methods outlined in OAC 3745-17-03(B)(3).

F. Miscellaneous Requirements

1. The following terms and conditions shall supersede all the air pollution control requirements for this emissions unit contained in permit to install number 14-4349 as issued on 5-21-97:
