This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The OC content of the cleaning materials employed in this operation shall not exceed 8.0 lbs/gal.
The OC emissions shall exceed 153.6 lbs/day and 19.97 TPY.
The use of any photochemically reactive material, as defined in OAC 3745-21-01(C)(5), is prohibited.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The amount of cleaning materials employed in this operation shall not exceed 19.2 gal/day and 4,992 gal/yr.
2. The permittee shall employ the following work practices to minimize OC emissions:
 - a. use covered storage containers for dispensing solvent to the operators,
 - b. cover all operator solvent containers except when actively rinsing the wiping cloth in solvent,
 - c. exercise care in transferring solvent from one container to another,
 - d. squeeze excess solvent from the wiping cloth to prevent splashing and dripping of solvent, and
 - e. use covered containers for the dirty wiping cloths.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain daily records of the following:
 - a. the company identification of each material employed in this emissions unit;
 - b. a record of each material employed, indicating whether or not the material is a photochemically reactive material;
 - c. the OC content of each material employed, in pounds per gallon;
 - d. the gallons of each material employed;
 - e. the total OC emissions, i.e., the summation of (c)(d) for all materials employed; and
 - f. the total gallons of all materials employed.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) in writing of any daily record showing the use of any photochemically reactive material, an exceedance of the OC content limit, daily OC emission limit and/or the daily usage limit. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) within 45 days after the exceedance occurs.

2. The permittee shall also submit annual reports which specify the total OC emissions and the total material usage for the previous calendar year. These reports shall be submitted by January 31 of each year.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Formulation data or USEPA method 24 (for coatings) or 24A (for flexographic and rotogravure printing inks and related coatings) shall be used to determine the OC contents of the inks and coatings.
2. Compliance with the OC content limit, daily OC emission limit, and/or material usage limit shall be demonstrated by the record keeping requirements in C.1.

F. Miscellaneous Requirements

1. The following terms and conditions shall supersede all the air pollution control requirements for this emissions unit contained in permit to install number 14-2581 as issued on 1/23/92:
