Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**
 - (a) The VOC content of all coatings in this emissions unit shall not exceed 7.8 pounds VOC per gallon of coating, excluding water and exempt solvents, as applied. The VOC content of all cleanup materials employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 7.04 pounds per gallon of cleanup material.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The coating material usage shall not exceed 2.8 gallons per day and 750 gallons per year.
2. The cleanup material usage shall not exceed 1.5 gallons per day and 200 gallons per year.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each day of the coating operation:
 - a. The company identification number of each coating material employed.
 - b. The VOC content of each coating material, as applied, in pounds per gallon, excluding water and exempt solvents.
 - c. The number of gallons of each coating material employed, excluding water and exempt solvents.
 - d. The name and identification of each cleanup material employed.
 - e. The number of gallons of each cleanup material employed.
 - f. The VOC content of each cleanup material, in pounds per gallon.
 - g. The total VOC emissions from all coatings employed (i.e., summation of b x c for each coating), in pounds.
 - h. The total VOC emissions from all cleanup materials employed (i.e., summation of e x f for each cleanup material), in pounds.
 - i. The total VOC emissions from all coatings and cleanup materials (i.e., the sum of g + h), in pounds.
 - j. The total coating material usage in gallons per day.
 - k. The total cleanup material usage in gallons per day.

2. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each year for this emissions unit:
 - a. The total VOC emissions (this is calculated as the sum of the daily VOC emissions in section C.1.i. for the calendar year divided by 2000), in tons.
 - b. The total coating usage (this is calculated as the sum of the daily coating usage in section C.1.j. for the calendar year), in gallons.
 - c. The total cleanup material usage (this is calculated as the sum of the daily cleanup material usage in section C.1.k. for the calendar year), in gallons.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Hamilton County Department of Environmental Services in writing of any daily record showing any of the following: that the coating line employed more than the applicable maximum daily coating or cleanup material usage limit or an exceedance of the VOC content limit for either coatings or cleanup materials. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Hamilton County Department of Environmental Services within 45 days after the exceedance occurs.
2. The permittee shall submit annual reports which specify the total VOC emissions (from coating and cleanup material usages) from this emissions unit for the previous calendar year. These reports shall be submitted by January 31 of each year.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitations in Section A.1. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:
 - a. Emission Limitations:
22.0 lbs/day and 2.93 TPY VOC from all coatings
11.0 lbs/day and 0.7 TPY VOC from all cleanup materials

Applicable compliance method:
Compliance with the daily VOC emission limitation shall be based upon the record keeping performed pursuant to section C.1. of this permit.

Compliance with the annual VOC emission limitation shall be based upon the record keeping performed pursuant to Section C.2.

 - b. Materials Usage Restrictions:
Coatings: 2.8 gallons per day and 750 gallons per year
Cleanup: 1.5 gallons per day and 200 gallons per year
- Compliance with the daily usage restrictions shall be based upon the record keeping performed pursuant to Section C.1. of this permit.
- Compliance with the annual usage restrictions shall be based upon the record keeping performed pursuant to Section C.2. of this permit.- 2. USEPA method 24 shall be used to determine the VOC content for coatings. If, pursuant to section 4.3 of Method 24, 40 CFR, Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24 cannot be used for a particular coating, the permittee shall so notify the Administrator of the USEPA and shall use formulation data for that coating to demonstrate compliance until the USEPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision statements for Method 24.
