This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. 2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The hourly and annual emission limitations specified above are based on the emissions unit's potential to emit. Therefore, no records are required to demonstrate compliance with the emission limitations. Compliance with OAC rule 3745-31-05(A)(3) shall be demonstrated by compliance with the emissions limitations.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permit to install for emissions units R001 and R002 was evaluated based on the actual materials and the design parameters of the emissions unit's exhaust system, as specified by the permittee in the permit to install application. The Ohio EPA's "Review of New Sources of Air Toxic Emissions" policy ("Air Toxic Policy") was applied to this emissions unit for each toxic pollutant, using data from the permit to install application, and modeling was performed for the toxic pollutant(s) emitted at over a ton per year using the SCREEN 3.0 model or other Ohio EPA approved model. The predicted 1-hour maximum ground-level concentration result(s) from the use of the SCREEN 3.0 (or other approved) model, was compared to the Maximum Acceptable Ground-Level Concentration (MAGLC). The following summarizes the results of the modeling for the "worst case" pollutant(s):

Pollutant: Ethanol
 TLV (mg/m3): 1884
 Maximum Hourly Emission Rate (lbs/hr): 3.4
 Predicted 1-Hour Maximum Ground-Level Concentration (ug/m3): 1485
 MAGLC (ug/m3): 44,863

The above described evaluation determined that the maximum ground level concentration for the new or modified source was less than 80% of the MAGLC. Per ORC 3704.03(F)(4)(d), the owner or operator shall submit an annual report that describes any changes to the emissions unit that affect the air toxic modeling. Changes that can affect the parameters used in applying the "Air Toxic Policy" include the following:

- a. changes in the composition of the materials used or the use of new materials, that would result in the emission of a compound or chemical with a lower Threshold Limit Value (TLV) than the lowest TLV previously modeled, as documented in the most current version of the American Conference of Governmental Industrial Hygienists' (ACGIH's) handbook entitled "TLVs and BEIs" ("Threshold Limit Values for Chemical Substances and Physical Agents, Biological Exposure Indices");
- b. changes in the composition of the materials, or use of new materials, that would result in an increase in emissions of any pollutant with a listed TLV that was proposed in the application and modeled; and

- c. physical changes to the emissions unit or its exhaust parameters (e.g., increased/ decreased exhaust flow, changes in stack height, changes in stack diameter, etc.).

The permittee shall submit annual reports that describe any changes to this emissions unit which affect the air toxic modeling. If no changes were made during the year, then a report shall be submitted stating that no changes were made. This report is due by January 31 of each year and shall cover the previous calendar year.

E. **Testing Requirements**

1. Compliance with the emission limitations specified in Section A.1 of the terms and conditions of this permit shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:

Emission Limitations:

Organic compound (OC) emissions shall not exceed 1.7 pounds per hour and 7.45 tons per year (TPY).

Applicable Compliance Method:

The hourly and annual OC emission limitations are based on the maximum hourly coating usage multiplied by the OC content of the coatings used, as provided in permit to install application 14-05823 submitted on March 14, 2006.

The hourly and annual emission limitations were calculated as follows:

$0.45 \text{ gallon of coating/hour} \times 3.71 \text{ lbs of OC/gallon of coating} = 1.7 \text{ lbs of OC per hour.}$

$1.7 \text{ lbs of OC/hour} \times 8760 \text{ hours/year} \times \text{ton}/2000 \text{ lbs} = 7.45 \text{ TPY.}$
