This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. 2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**
 - (a) The VOC content of each coating employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 6.3 pounds per gallon, as applied, excluding water and exempt solvents.
The VOC content of each cleanup material employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 7.34 pounds per gallon, as applied.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. Coating usage shall not exceed 10 gallons/day and 228 gallons/year.
2. Cleanup material usage shall not exceed 98 gallons /year.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain daily records of the following:
 - a. The name and identification number of each coating and cleanup material employed.
 - b. The VOC content of each coating (excluding water and exempt solvents) and cleanup material employed, as applied, in pounds per gallon.
 - c. The total gallons of all coatings and all cleanup materials employed.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) in writing of any daily record which shows an exceedance of the VOC content limits and/or the daily coating usage limit. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) within 45 days after the exceedance occurs.
2. The permittee shall also submit annual reports which specify the total coating and cleanup material usages for the previous calendar year. These reports shall be submitted by January 31 of each year.

E. Testing Requirements

1. USEPA Method 24 shall be used to determine the VOC content for each coating employed. If, pursuant to section 4.3 of Method 24, 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24 cannot be

used for a particular coating, the permittee shall so notify the Administrator of the USEPA and shall use formulation data for that coating to demonstrate compliance until the USEPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision statements for Method 24.

2. Formulation data shall be used to determine the VOC content for each cleanup material employed.
3. Compliance with the VOC content limits and the daily usage limit shall be demonstrated by the record keeping requirements in C.1.
