This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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**Part II - Special Terms and Conditions**

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

**B. Operational Restrictions**

1. The maximum amount of material unloaded by this emissions unit shall not exceed 3000 TPY.
2. The permittee shall ensure the baghouse is used during the entire truck unloading operation and the subsequent transfer of lime to the silo.

**C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements**

1. The permittee shall maintain monthly records which indicate the total tons of material unloaded.

**D. Reporting Requirements**

1. The permittee shall submit an annual report which summarizes the amount of material unloaded during each calendar month. The reports shall be submitted by February 15 of each year and shall cover the previous twelve calendar months.

**E. Testing Requirements**

1. Compliance with the PM/PM10 emission limitations outlined in this permit shall be demonstrated using the emission factors, control efficiencies (if applicable), and the operational parameters specified in the PTI application 14-2885 submitted on January 27, 1993.
2. Compliance with the visible particulate emission limitation given in OAC rule 3745-17-07(A)(1) shall be demonstrated by the methods outlined in OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(1).
3. Compliance with the limitation on material unloading shall be demonstrated by the recordkeeping requirement in term C.1.

**F. Miscellaneous Requirements**

1. If probable cause exists indicating the source is causing or contributing to a nuisance in violation of OAC rule 3745-15-07, the owner or operator of this emissions unit shall be required to submit and implement a control program which will bring this source into compliance.
