This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. 2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**
 - (b) The use of photochemically reactive materials, as defined in OAC 3745-21-01(C)(5), is prohibited.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The permittee shall not package in this emissions unit any materials that have an adopted Threshold Limit Value (TLV) - Time Weighted Average(TWA) from the ACGIH handbook with both a TLV-TWA less than 5 milligrams per cubic meter and a vapor pressure greater than 0.193 psia.
2. The permittee shall not package in this emissions unit any liquid organic material listed in the ACGIH handbook with a vapor pressure greater than 3.45 psia at 68 degrees Fahrenheit.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain monthly records of the following:
 - a. the name and identification of each liquid organic material;
 - b. the number of gallons of each liquid organic material;
 - c. the vapor pressure of each liquid organic material; and
 - d. a record of each liquid organic material employed in this emissions unit indicating, whether or not the liquid organic material is a photochemically reactive material.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) in writing of any monthly record which shows the use of photochemically reactive materials and/or an exceedance of the vapor pressure limitations. A copy of each such record and shall be sent to the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) within 45 days after the exceedance occurs.
2. Prior to packaging any material other than those listed in the permit to install 14-2506 submitted 10/11/91, the Hamilton County Department of Environmental Services shall be notified in writing 30 days in advance of such change.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitations outlined in this permit shall be demonstrated by the emission factors, control efficiencies (if applicable) and the operational parameters in PTI application 14-2506 as submitted on 10/11/91.

2. Compliance with the vapor pressure limits shall be demonstrated by the record keeping requirements in C. 1.
- F. **Miscellaneous Requirements**
1. The following terms and conditions shall supersede all the air pollution control requirements for this emissions unit contained in permit to install 14-2506 as modified on 4/6/95: A-E.
