This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. B. Operational Restrictions

1. The maximum daily coating usage for this emissions unit shall not exceed 10 gallons.
2. The maximum annual coating usage for this emissions unit shall not exceed 2749 gallons.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each day for the coating line:
 - a. The name and identification number of each coating employed.
 - b. The VOC content of each coating, as applied, in pounds per gallon.
 - c. The volume of each coating employed, in gallons.
 - d. The VOC emissions from each coating employed, in pounds.
 - e. The total VOC emissions from all coatings employed, in pounds.
2. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each month:
 - a. The name and identification of each cleanup material employed.
 - b. The number of gallons of each cleanup material employed.
 - c. The VOC content of each cleanup material employed, in pounds per gallon.
 - d. The VOC emissions from each clean material employed, in pounds.
 - e. The total VOC emissions from all cleanup materials employed, in pounds per month.
3. The permittee shall record the total annual VOC emissions from this emissions unit, in TPY (i.e., the annual sum of C.1.e and C.2.e. above divided by 2000 pounds/ton).

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director of any daily record showing that the coating line employs more than the

applicable maximum daily coating usage limit. A copy of such record shall be sent to the Director within 45 days after the exceedance occurs.

E. Testing Requirements

1. U.S. EPA Methods 24 and 24A shall be used to determine the VOC contents for (a) coatings and (b) flexographic and rotogravure printing inks and related coatings, respectively. If, pursuant to section 4.3 of Method 24, 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24 or 24A cannot be used for a particular coating or ink, the owner or operator shall so notify the Administrator of the U.S. EPA and shall use formulation data for that coating or ink to demonstrate compliance until the U.S. EPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision statements for Method 24 or 24A.
2. Compliance with the coating usage limit shall be demonstrated by the recordkeeping requirement in T&C C.1.
