This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The maximum throughput of recycled oil shall not exceed 20,000 gallons per day.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain daily records of the amount of oil recycled, in gallons.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit deviation (excursion) reports which identify any exceedences of the throughput limitation of 20,000 gallons of oil/day, as well as the corrective actions taken to achieve compliance with the limitation.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the visible emission limit in A.1. shall be determined by the methods outlined in OAC 3745-17-03 (B)(1).
2. Compliance with the OC emissions limits shall be determined by employing the AP-42 emission factor of 0.2 lb OC/1000 gallon of oil processed.

F. Miscellaneous Requirements

1. The following terms and conditions shall supersede all the air pollution control requirements for this emissions unit contained in permit to install 14-4213 as issued on October 9, 1996: A-E.
