This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The VOC content (as applied) of each coating material employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 5.37 lbs/gal, excluding water and exempt solvents.
The VOC content of each cleanup material employed shall not exceed 7.01 lbs/gal.
The coating usage shall not exceed 13 gallons per day and 816 gallons per year, based on a 12-month rolling summation.
The usage of cleanup materials shall not exceed 0.96 gallon per day and 57.85 gallons per year.

B. Operational Restrictions

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain daily records which include the following:
 - a. the company identification of each coating material employed;
 - b. the number of gallons of each coating material employed;
 - c. the total number of gallons of all coating materials employed;
 - d. the VOC content of each coating material, as applied, in lbs/gallon and in lbs/gallon excluding water and exempt solvents;
 - e. the number of gallons of each cleanup material employed;
 - f. the total number of gallons of all cleanup materials employed;
 - g. the VOC content of each cleanup material employed; and
 - h. the total VOC emissions (i.e., the summation of b x c for each coating material + d x e for each cleanup material).
2. The permittee shall maintain monthly records of the rolling, 12-month summation of the coating usage. This shall include the information for the current month and the preceding eleven months.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit quarterly deviation (excursion) reports that identify all exceedances of the daily VOC emission limitation, the VOC content limitations for the coating materials and cleanup materials, the daily usage restrictions for coating materials and cleanup materials, and the rolling, 12-month usage restriction for coating materials.

2. The permittee shall submit annual reports, by February 1 of each year, that summarize the total VOC emissions, total coating material usage, and total cleanup material usage for the previous calendar year.

E. Testing Requirements

1. USEPA Method 24 shall be used to determine the VOC content of each coating material. If, pursuant to section 4.3 of Method 24, 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24 cannot be used for a particular coating, the permittee shall so notify the Administrator of the USEPA and shall use formulation data for that coating or ink to demonstrate compliance until the USEPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision statements for Method 24. Formulation data or USEPA Method 24 shall be used to determine the VOC content of each cleanup material.
2. Compliance with the usage and emission limitations shall be demonstrated by the record keeping requirements in term C.
