This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. **Part II - Special Terms and Conditions**

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

**A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements**

1. **2. Additional Terms and Conditions**

- (a) The maximum organic compound (OC) content of the coating materials employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 5.9 pounds per gallon.  
The maximum OC content of the cleanup materials employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 7.9 pounds per gallon.

**B. Operational Restrictions**

**C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements**

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information each day for this emissions unit:
  - a. the company identification for each coating and cleanup material employed;
  - b. the number of gallons of each coating and cleanup material employed;
  - c. the OC content of each coating and cleanup material, in pounds per gallon;
  - d. the OC emission rate for each coating and cleanup material, in pounds per day;
  - e. the total OC emission rate for all coatings and cleanup materials, in pounds per day;
  - f. the total number of hours the emissions unit was in operation; and
  - g. the average hourly OC emission rate for all coatings and cleanup materials, i.e., (e)/(f), in pounds per hour (average).

**D. Reporting Requirements**

1. The permittee shall notify the appropriate Ohio EPA field office of any daily record which shows an exceedance of the OC content limits and/or the hourly and daily OC emission limits. A copy of such record shall be submitted within 30 days of any such exceedance.

**E. Testing Requirements**

1. The OC content of each coating or cleanup material employed in this emissions unit shall be determined by using formulation data or USEPA Methods 24 and 24A for (a) coatings and (b) flexographic and rotogravure printing lines and related coatings, respectively. If, pursuant to section 4.3 of Method 24, 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24 or 24A cannot be used for a particular coating or ink, the permittee shall so notify the Administrator of the USEPA and shall use formulation data for that coating or ink to demonstrate compliance until the USEPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision

statements for Method 24 or 24A.

2. Compliance with the OC emission limits in section A.1. of these T&Cs shall be determined by the recordkeeping requirements of T&C C.1..
