This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. 2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**
 - (a) The OC content of each adhesive employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 4.88 lbs per gallon. The OC content of each cleanup material employed in this emissions unit shall not exceed 6.71 lbs per gallon.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The material usage shall not exceed the following limitations:
 - a. adhesives - 6.84 gallons per day and 2480 gallons per year ; and
 - b. cleanup materials -1 gallon per day and 264 gallons per year.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information for each day for the adhesive coating operation:
 - a. The company identification of each adhesive and cleanup material employed.
 - b. The total number of gallons of all adhesives and all cleanup materials employed.
 - c. The OC content of each adhesive and cleanup material employed, in pounds per gallon.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency) in writing of any daily record which shows an exceedance of the OC content limits and/or the daily usage limits. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be submitted within 45 days after the exceedance occurs.
2. The permittee shall also submit annual reports which specify the total adhesive and cleanup material usages for the previous calendar year. These reports shall be submitted by February 15 of each year.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Formulation data or USEPA Method 24 shall be used to determine the OC content of each adhesive and cleanup material employed.
2. Compliance with the OC content limits and the daily usage limits shall be demonstrated by the record keeping requirements in C.1.
