This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The combined material usage in the rubber dip operation shall not exceed 570 gallons per year, as applied.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information for each day for the coating operation:
 - a. The company identification for each coating and photochemically reactive cleanup material employed.
 - b. The number of gallons of each coating and photochemically reactive cleanup material employed.
 - c. The organic compound content (as applied) of each coating and photochemically reactive cleanup material, in pounds per gallon.
 - d. The total organic compound emission rate for all coatings and photochemically reactive cleanup materials, in pounds per day.
 - e. The total number of hours the emissions unit was in operation.
 - f. The average hourly organic compound emission rate for all coatings and photochemically reactive cleanup materials, i.e., (d)/(e), in pounds per hour (average).

[Note: The coating information must be for the coatings as employed, including any thinning solvents added at the emissions unit. Also, the definition of "photochemically reactive material" is based upon OAC rule 3745-21-01(C)(5).]

2. The permittee shall collect and record the following information for the purpose of determining annual organic compound emissions:
 - a. The company identification for each nonphotochemically reactive cleanup material employed.
 - b. The number of gallons of each nonphotochemically reactive cleanup material employed.
 - c. The organic compound content (as applied) of each nonphotochemically reactive cleanup material, in pounds

per gallon.

d. The total organic compound emission rate for all nonphotochemically reactive cleanup materials, in tons.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit deviation (excursion) reports which include the following information:

a. An identification of each day during which the average hourly organic compound emissions from the coatings and photochemically reactive cleanup materials exceeded 8 pounds per hour, and the actual average hourly organic compound emissions for each such day.

b. An identification of each day during which the organic compound emissions from the coatings and photochemically reactive cleanup materials exceeded 40 pounds per day, and the actual organic compound emissions for each such day.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Formulation data or USEPA method 24 shall be used to determine the OC contents of the coatings and cleanup materials.

2. Compliance with the usage and emission limitations shall be demonstrated by the record keeping requirements in term C.
