This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

 - (b) The facility will post in a prominent place near this incinerator, complete operating instructions for its proper use.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. Only employees properly trained in the operation of this incinerator shall be allowed to operate it.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

D. Reporting Requirements

1. In the case of an equipment breakdown or permanent shutdown, the person responsible for such equipment shall immediately notify the Ohio environmental protection agency withing 72 hours. The notification should contain the identification, location, and type of breakdown/shutdown of such equipment including the Ohio environmental protection agency permit application number for each air contaminant source.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Upon request by Ohio EPA, this emissions unit shall be tested to determine compliance with the allowable mass emission rate limit of 0.10 pounds of particulate matter per one hundred pounds charged using USEPA Method 5, pursuant to OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(8)
2. Compliance with the visible emissions limit in section A of this permit shall be determined using Method 9, pursuant to OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(1).
