This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

2. For the purpose of a permit-to-operate document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are enforceable under state law only with the exception of those listed below which are federally enforceable.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) Volatile organic compound (VOC) emissions from the loading and storage of transmix shall not exceed 8.37 pounds per 1000 gallons of transmix loaded and 5.69 tons per year. The potential emissions of hazardous air pollutants (HAPS) from this facility, as identified in section 112 (b) of Title III of the Clean Air Act, shall not exceed 10 tons per year for any single HAP and 25 tons per year for any combination of HAPS. The permittee shall not load in any one day more than 40,000 gallons of any volatile photochemically reactive material into any tank truck, trailer, or railroad tank car from this emissions unit. VOC emissions from the loading of transmix into any tank truck, trailer, or railroad tank car shall not exceed 5.0 pounds per thousand gallons loaded, and 2.50 tons per year.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The permittee shall store only transmix in this emissions unit (tank 3609).
2. The permittee shall limit the daily throughput of transmix for this emissions unit (tank 3609) to 63,000 gallons (1,500 bbls).
3. The permittee shall limit the annual throughput of transmix for this emissions unit (tank 3609) to 1,000,000 gallons (23,810 bbls), based on a rolling, 12-month summation.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain monthly records indicating the total transmix throughput, and the rolling, 12-month summation of transmix throughput.
2. The permittee shall maintain daily records for this emissions unit that include the following information:
 - a. the date;
 - b. the liquid height in the tank;
 - c. the product(s) introduced into the tank;
 - d. the number of barrels of each product introduced;
 - e. the number of barrels removed daily; and
 - f. the monthly subtotals of throughputs for:
 - i. gasoline;
 - ii. fuel oil;
 - iii. kerosene; and
 - iv. sump.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall immediately notify the Akron Regional Air Quality Management District of any exceedance of the daily throughput limitation for transmix specified in section B.2, along with the cause of the exceedance and an explanation of any corrective action taken to prevent a similar exceedance in the future. This report shall be submitted within thirty (30) days of the exceedance.

2. The permittee shall immediately notify the Akron Regional Air Quality Management District of any exceedance of the annual throughput limitation for transmix, based on a rolling, 12-month summation, specified in section B.3, along with the cause of the exceedance and an explanation of any corrective action taken to prevent a similar exceedance in the future. This report shall be submitted within thirty (30) days of the exceedance.
 3. The permittee shall submit an annual report of the total throughput for transmix during the calendar year, and the estimated total VOC emissions as specified in sections A.2.a and A.2.d. This annual report shall be submitted by February 1 of each year and shall cover the calendar period from January through December.
 4. The permittee shall immediately notify the Akron Regional Air Quality Management District of any exceedance of the HAP emission limitations specified in section A.2.b. A copy of the records indicating the exceedance shall be submitted within 30 days of the exceedance.
- E. **Testing Requirements**
1. Compliance with the VOC emission limitations shall be demonstrated in accordance with the procedures for using Tanks Program 3.1 and AP-42.
- F. **Miscellaneous Requirements**
1. The following special terms and conditions of this variance to operate are federally enforceable requirements: A, B, C, D, E and F.
