This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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**Part II - Special Terms and Conditions**

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

**A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements**

1. **2. Additional Terms and Conditions**

- (a) The permittee shall employ best available technology (BAT) to control particulate matter emissions from this emissions unit. The control technology shall include the following:
  - i. the installation and employment of a fabric filter (baghouse), in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, instructions, and operating manual(s), to adequately control particulate emissions; and
  - ii. the installation and employment of hoods, fans, and other equipment, in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, instructions, and operating manual(s), to adequately enclose, contain, capture, and vent particulate matter to the baghouse.  
The particulate matter emission limitation required by this rule is less stringent than the emission limitation required by BAT.

**B. Operational Restrictions**

1. The pressure drop across the baghouse shall be maintained within the range of 1 - 2 inches of water while the emissions unit is in operation.

**C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements**

1. The permittee shall properly install, operate, and maintain equipment to monitor the pressure drop across the baghouse while the emissions unit is in operation. The monitoring equipment shall be installed, calibrated, operated, and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, instructions, and operating manual(s). The permittee shall record the pressure drop across the baghouse on a daily basis.

**D. Reporting Requirements**

1. The permittee shall submit pressure drop deviation (excursion) reports that identify all periods of time during which the pressure drop across the baghouse did not comply with the allowable range specified above.

**E. Testing Requirements**

1. Compliance with the emission limitations in Section A.1 of these terms and conditions shall be determined in

accordance with the following methods:

Emission Limitation:

0.2 lb/hr of particulate matter

Applicable Compliance Method:

Multiply the particulate emission factor of 0.2 pound of particulate emissions per ton of production by the maximum hourly production rate.

The emission factor is based on a material balance analysis including an assumed overall control efficiency of 97%.

Emission Limitation:

no visible particulate fugitive emissions from building ventilation

Applicable Compliance Method:

OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(4)

Emission Limitation:

5% opacity as a six-minute average

Applicable Compliance Method:

OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(1)

**F. Miscellaneous Requirements**

1. The permittee is hereby notified that this permit, and all agency records concerning the operation of this permitted emissions unit, are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC rule 3745-49-03.
2. The permittee shall comply with any applicable State and federal requirements governing the storage, treatment, transport and disposal of any waste material generated by the operation of the emissions unit.
3. The following terms and conditions shall supersede all the air pollution control requirements for this emissions unit contained in permit to install 16-1700, as issued on August 27, 1997:
