This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

2. For the purpose of a permit-to-operate document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are enforceable under state law only with the exception of those listed below which are federally enforceable.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**
 - (a) The permittee shall install and maintain exhaust stacks which are not less than 25 feet above ground level. These stacks shall be vertical with no obstructions such as rain caps or elbows. The 16.15 lbs of OC/hr limit was established for permit to install purposes to verify compliance with the Ohio EPA Air Toxics Policy. Therefore, it is not necessary to develop record keeping and/or reporting requirements to ensure compliance with this limit.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The permittee shall not use more than 1150 gallons of coatings/month in this emissions unit.
2. Water shall be the only cleanup material employed in this emissions unit.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall collect and record the following information for each month for this emissions unit:
 - a. The name and identification of each coating, as applied.
 - b. The VOC content of each coating (excluding water and exempt solvents), as applied, in lbs/gallon.
 - c. The volume of each coating employed, in gallons.
 - d. The total volume of all coatings employed, in gallons.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (the Ohio EPA, Central District Office) in writing of any monthly record showing the use of noncomplying coatings or any monthly record showing that the coating usage limitation was exceeded. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director (the Ohio EPA, Central District Office) within 30 days following the end of the calendar month.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitation(s) in Section A.1 of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following method(s):
Emission Limitation:
VOC emissions shall not exceed 3.5 lbs/gallon of coating, excluding water and exempt solvents.

Applicable Compliance Method:
OAC rule 3745-21-10(B). USEPA Method 24 shall be used to determine the VOC contents for the coatings. If, pursuant to section 4.3 of Method 24, 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, an owner or operator determines that Method 24 cannot be used for a particular coating, the permittee shall so notify the Administrator of the USEPA

and shall use formulation data for that coating to demonstrate compliance until the USEPA provides alternative analytical procedures or alternative precision statements for Method 24.
