This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The allowable particulate emission rate is based upon OAC rule 3745-17-11, Figure II. Table I of OAC rule 3745-17-11 is not applicable because the limit based upon Table I is less stringent than the limit based upon Figure II.
The permittee shall not employ liquid organic materials in this emissions unit which are photochemically reactive materials, as defined in OAC rule 3745-21-01 (C)(5).

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The pressure drop across the baghouse shall be maintained within the range of 2 to 4 inches of water while the emissions unit is in operation.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall properly operate and maintain equipment to monitor the pressure drop across the baghouse while the emissions unit is in operation. The monitoring equipment shall be installed, calibrated, operated, and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, instructions, and operating manual(s). The permittee shall record the pressure drop across the baghouse on weekly basis.
2. The permittee shall keep the following daily records for each material employed in this emissions unit:
 - a. the identification of each chemical compound and its physical state; and
 - b. for each liquid organic material, an indication of whether or not the material is a photochemically reactive material, as defined in OAC rule 3745-21-01 (C)(5).

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit pressure drop deviation (excursion) reports that identify all periods of time during which the pressure drop across the baghouse did not comply with the allowable range specified in section B.1 of these terms and conditions.
2. The permittee shall submit pressure drop deviation (excursion) reports that identify all periods of time during which the pressure drop across the baghouse did not comply with the allowable range specified in section B.1 of these terms and conditions.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the allowable emission limits in section A.1 of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:
 - a. Emission Limitation:
20% opacity as a 6-minute average from the stack

Applicable Compliance Method:
Compliance shall be determined by visible emission evaluations performed in accordance with OAC rule 3745-17-03 (B)(1) using the test methods and procedures specified in U. S. EPA Reference Method 9.
 - b. Emission Limitation:
2 lbs/hr of PE

Applicable Compliance Method:
Compliance shall be determined by particulate emission evaluations performed in accordance with OAC rule 3745-17-03 (B)(10) using the test methods and procedures specified in U. S. EPA Reference Method 1 - 5, if required by Ohio EPA.
