This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. **Part II - Special Terms and Conditions**

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

**2. Additional Terms and Conditions**

- (a) Weigh-Hopper Loading of Cement, Sand, and Aggregate:
 

The cement hopper shall be adequately enclosed and the enclosure shall be sufficient so as to eliminate at all times visible emissions of fugitive dust.

The aggregate and sand to be loaded into the weigh-hopper and the conveyor shall have a moisture content sufficient so as to minimize or eliminate at all times visible emissions of fugitive dust. Water spraying devices shall be utilized, if necessary, to control visible emissions of fugitive dust from this source. The transfer conveyor discharge shall be enclosed and vented to the fabric filter. The enclosure shall be sufficient so as to eliminate at all times visible emissions of fugitive dust at the point of capture. Loading of Transit Mix Trucks:

The point at which the transit mix truck is loaded shall be enclosed and the drop height of the cement/sand/aggregate mixture into the truck shall be minimized or controlled by either a telescopic or hooded chute so as to minimize or eliminate visible emissions of fugitive dust from this operation. Visible Emissions Limitations from Material Handling Operations:

The fabric filter associated with the transfer conveyor discharge enclosure shall achieve an outlet emission rate of not greater than 0.030 grains of particulate emissions per dry standard cubic foot of exhaust gas or there shall be no visible emissions from the outlet, whichever is greater.

Visible particulate emissions from the transit mix truck loading operation and all other fugitive emissions associated with this source shall not exceed twenty (20) percent opacity as a three (3) minute average.
