This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. 2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**
 - (a) This incinerator and all associated equipment and grounds shall be designed, operated and maintained so as to prevent the emission of objectionable odors.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The incinerator shall be operated only by adequately trained personnel.
2. This emissions unit shall not be used to dispose of infectious or medical waste as defined in OAC rule 3745-75-01 (B)(27).
3. The heat timer model MLS-A smoke alarm system shall be operated at all times when the incinerator is in operation and shall be maintained in accordance with the recommendations of the manufacturer.
4. During a cremation burn, the temperature of the secondary combustion chamber shall be maintained at a minimum of 1500 degrees Fahrenheit.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall operate and maintain a continuous temperature monitor and recorder for the secondary combustion chamber operating temperature. The temperature monitor and recorder shall be calibrated, operated and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendation, instructions and applicable operating manual(s).

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit temperature deviation (excursion) reports that identify all periods of time during which the secondary combustion chamber temperature did not comply with the temperature limitation specified above.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitations in section A.1 of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:
Emission Limitation:

Particulate emissions shall not exceed 0.10 pound per 100 pounds of material charged.

Applicable Compliance Method:

If required, compliance shall be demonstrated by performing an emission test in accordance with the methods

and procedures specified in 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, Methods 1 through 5 and the procedures specified in OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(8).

Emission Limitation:

Visible particulate emissions shall not exceed 5% opacity as a 6-minute average.

Applicable Compliance Method:

Compliance shall be demonstrated based on visible particulate emission observations performed in accordance with the method and procedures specified in 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, Method 9.
