This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The lint collector bags, filters and cages are to be used at all times when the dryer is in operation. These devices should be maintained in good operational condition at all times. At a minimum of at least once per day, the permittee shall check the operation of the lint collectors and the cages located on the roof of the facility. This inspection should include, but not be limited to, inspection of the filter bags to assure that they remain properly attached and are not overfilled, as well as inspection and emptying of the cages on the roof as necessary. The permittee shall inspect the roof of the facility on a daily basis and collect and properly dispose of any loose lint. This source and its associated lint collector shall be maintained regularly in accordance with accepted engineering practices and recommendations of the respective manufacturers in order to minimize air contaminant emission releases.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain an inspection log and all inspections of the dryer lint control systems shall be recorded. These logs must be maintained for a period of at least two years and may be inspected by representatives of the Ohio EPA during normal business hours.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance of visible particulate emissions limit shall be determined by visible emission evaluations performed in accordance with procedures specified in OAC 3745-17-03 (B) (1) using the methods and procedures specified in U.S. EPA Reference Method 9.
2. Emissions Limitation: PM: 6.10 lb/hour

Applicable Compliance Method:
No testing is specifically required to demonstrate compliance with this emission limitation, but if appropriate, may be requested pursuant to OAC 3745-15-04(A).
