This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. 2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (b) **Control of Fugitive Dust from Material Handling Operations:**
 All sand and aggregate transferred to the elevated storage bins shall contain sufficient moisture so as to minimize or eliminate visible emissions of fugitive dust. Water spraying shall be utilized, if necessary, to control excessive fugitive dust emissions from these operations.
 During the loading of the sand and aggregate to the conveyor, the drop height of the front-end loader shall be minimized in order to minimize or eliminate the visible emissions of fugitive dust. Water spraying devices shall be utilized, if necessary, at conveyor transfer points to control and/or eliminate the visible emissions of fugitive dust.
 Cement shall be transferred pneumatically to the storage silo. The pneumatic system shall be adequately enclosed so as to eliminate at all times visible emissions of fugitive dust. Any visible emissions of cement dust emanating from the delivery vehicle during transfer shall be cause for the immediate halt of the unloading process and the refusal of delivery of the cement until the situation is corrected.
 The cement silo vent shall be adequately enclosed and vented to a fabric filter. The enclosure shall be sufficient so as to minimize at all times visible emissions of fugitive dust at the point of capture.
 The fabric filter on the cement silo shall achieve an outlet emission rate of not greater than 0.030 grain of particulate emissions per dry standard cubic foot of exhaust gas or there shall be no visible emissions from the outlet, whichever is greater.
 Visible particulate emissions from all other fugitive emissions associated with this emissions unit shall not exceed twenty (20) percent opacity as a three (3)-minute average.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain records of the amounts of sand, stone and cement processed at this facility so as to be able to determine the actual amount of fugitive dust emissions generated over any annual period.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. None

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitations in sections A.1. and A.2. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:
 Emission Limitation: Particulate emissions no greater than 3.2 tons per year.

Applicable Compliance Method: AP-42 emission factors, Table 8.10-2, and compilation of annual material usage data recorded as required in section C.1. of these terms and conditions.
 Emission Limitation: The fabric filter on the cement silo shall achieve an outlet emission rate of not greater than 0.030 grain of particulate emissions per dry standard cubic foot of exhaust gas or there shall be no visible

emissions from the outlet, whichever is greater.

Applicable Compliance Methods:

i. If required, OAC rule 3745-17-01(B)(11); and/or

ii. 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, Method 22.

Emissions Limitation: Visible particulate emissions from all other fugitive emissions associated with this emissions unit shall not exceed twenty (20) percent opacity as a three (3)-minute average.

Applicable Compliance Method: Compliance shall be determined through visible emission observations in accordance with 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, Method 9 and the procedures specified in OAC rule 3745-17-03 (B)(1).

F. Miscellaneous Requirements

1. The following terms and conditions shall supersede all the air pollution control requirements for this emissions unit contained in permit to install 02-10573, as issued on April 23, 1997: A and C.
