This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. Additional applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures (if any) may be specified in narrative form following the table.

The permittee shall employ reasonably available control measures that are sufficient to minimize or eliminate visible emissions of fugitive dust.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The permittee shall have fire extinguishers of the appropriate type located near any cutting stations and they shall be employed promptly to extinguish any accidental fires caused by cutting operations.
2. The permittee shall employ accepted practices when cutting torches are being used to minimize resulting visible emissions. Such practices shall include, but not be limited to, the following items: cutting metal that is clean of any oil(s) or other combustible fluids, the minimization of flame impingement with the ground, and the use of the appropriately sized cutting torch(es).
3. In accordance with OAC rule 3745-19-03, any open burning of solid waste at this facility is prohibited. Any accidental fires that may be caused by torch cutting operations shall be reported.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall perform daily checks, when the emissions unit is in operation and when the weather conditions allow, for any visible fugitive particulate emissions from the egress points (i.e., torch cutting areas, stations, etc.) serving this emissions unit. The presence or absence of any visible fugitive emissions shall be noted in an operations log. If visible emissions are observed, the permittee shall also note the following in the operations log:
 - a. the location and color of the emissions;
 - b. whether the emissions are representative of normal operations;
 - c. if the emissions are not representative of normal operations, the cause of the abnormal emissions;
 - d. the total duration of any visible emission incident; and
 - e. any corrective actions taken to minimize or eliminate the visible emissions.

If visible emissions are present, a visible emission incident has occurred. The observer does not have to document the exact start and end times for the visible emission incident under item (d) above or continue the daily check until the incident has ended. The observer may indicate that the visible emission incident was continuous during the observation period (or, if known, continuous during the operation of the emissions unit). With respect to the documentation of corrective actions, the observer may indicate that no corrective actions were taken if the visible emissions were representative of normal operations, or specify the minor corrective actions that were taken to ensure that the emissions unit continued to operate under normal conditions, or specify the corrective actions that were taken to eliminate abnormal visible emissions.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit semiannual written reports that (a) identify all days during which any visible fugitive

particulate emissions were observed from the egress points (i.e., torch cutting areas, stations, etc.) serving this emissions unit and (b) describe any corrective actions taken to minimize or eliminate the visible fugitive particulate emissions. These reports shall be submitted to the Director (the Ohio EPA Northeast District Office) by January 31 and July 31 of each year and shall cover the previous 6-month period.

2. The permittee shall report any accidental fires, not immediately extinguished, that may be caused by the torch cutting operation at this facility. A written report shall be submitted to the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control, Northeast District Office and the Mahoning-Trumbull Air Pollution Agency no later than 15 days following the incident.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitations in section A.1. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:
Emission Limitation:

Visible fugitive particulate emissions from this emissions unit shall not exceed 20% opacity as a 3-minute average.

Applicable Compliance Method:

Compliance with the visible emission limitation for the fugitive particulate emissions shall be determined in accordance with Test Method 9 as set forth in "Appendix on Test Methods" in 40 CFR Part 60 ("Standards of Performance for New Stationary Sources"), as such Appendix existed on July 1, 1996, and the modifications listed in paragraphs (B)(3) and (B)(3)(b) of OAC rule 3745-17-03.

2. Compliance with OAC rule 3745-17-08(B) shall be determined by the method specified in OAC rule 3745-17-08 (C).
