Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) Pursuant to OAC rule 3745-21-07(A)(1), this facility is exempt from the requirements of OAC rule 3745-21-07(G) since the facility is not located in a Priority I county as specified in OAC rule 3745-21-06(A). (This facility is located in Wayne County). Hazardous Air Pollutant (HAP) emissions from this emissions unit shall not exceed 0.8 ton per year of single HAP* and 1.6 tons per year of combined HAPs*.

*The HAP emission limitations reflect the potentials to emit for this emissions unit; therefore, it is not necessary to develop monitoring, record keeping and/or reporting requirements to ensure compliance with these HAP limitations. The use of subfloor and construction adhesive is an assumed inherent physical limitation for this emissions unit and the maximum HAP contents of 10% single HAP and 20% combined HAP for the subfloor and construction adhesives employed is established industry standard. The maximum adhesives usage is 9209, 29-ounce tubes per year.

A listing of the HAPs can be found in Section 112(b) of the Clean Air Act or can be obtained by contacting your Ohio EPA, Northeast District Office contact. Material Safety Data Sheets typically include a listing of the solvents contained in the adhesives.
