

The following terms and conditions are hereby expressly incorporated into this permit to operate:

1. This permit to operate shall be effective until 04/16/99
You will be contacted approximately six months prior to this date regarding the renewal of this permit. If you are not contacted, please write to the appropriate Ohio EPA field office.
2. The above-described source is and shall remain in full compliance with all applicable State and federal laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit.
3. Prior to any modification of this source, as defined in rule 3745-31-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), a permit to install must be granted by the Ohio EPA pursuant to OAC Chapter 3745-31.
4. The Director of the Ohio EPA or an authorized representative may, subject to the safety requirements of the permit holder, enter upon the premises of this source at any time for purposes of making inspections, conducting tests, examining records or reports pertaining to any emission of air contaminants, and determining compliance with any applicable State and federal air pollution laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit.
5. A permit fee in the amount specified above must be remitted within 15 days from the issuance date of this permit.
6. Any transferee of this permit shall assume the responsibilities of the prior permit holder. The appropriate Ohio EPA field office must be notified in writing of any transfer of this permit.
7. This source and any associated air pollution control system(s) shall be maintained regularly in accordance with good engineering practices in order to minimize air contaminant emissions. Any malfunction of this source or any associated air pollution control system(s) shall be reported immediately to the appropriate Ohio EPA field office in accordance with OAC rule 3745-15-06. Except as provided in that rule, any scheduled maintenance or malfunction necessitating the shutdown or bypassing of any air pollution control system(s) shall be accompanied by the shutdown of this source.
8. Any unauthorized or emergency release of an air contaminant from this source which, due to the toxic or hazardous nature of the material, may pose a threat to public health, or otherwise endanger the safety or welfare of the public, shall be reported immediately to the appropriate Ohio EPA field office (during normal business hours) or to the Ohio EPA's Emergency Response Group (1-800-282-9378). (Additional reporting may be required pursuant to the federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act.)

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Applicable State Regulations:

The following rules of the Ohio Administrative Code establish the applicable emission limitations and/or control requirements of this emissions unit:

3745-17-07(A-D) 3745-18-82(F) 3745-17-10

(This condition in no way limits the applicability of other requirements of the Ohio Administrative Code to this source).

2. Applicable Federal Regulations:

In addition to the above State regulations, this emissions unit must comply with the following federal regulations:

40 CFR 52.1881(a)(58)(v)

(This condition in no way limits the applicability of other requirements of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) to this emission unit).

3. Federal Enforceable Limitations on Potential to Emit:

By request of the applicant and pursuant to OAC rule 3745-35-07, the following listed Special Terms and Conditions are federally enforceable and incorporated into this permit to limit the potential to emit for this emissions unit.

STC No. 4, 5, 6 and 7

4. Allowable Emission Limitation(s):

The emissions from this emissions unit shall not exceed the following:

A. Short-term emission limit.

1. 0.020 lb PM/MMBTU Actual Heat Input [This allowable came from OAC 3745-17-10(B)(1)].

2. 0.0006 lb SO₂/MMBTU Actual Heat Input (This is a voluntary restriction requested by the applicant).
3. 0.14 lb NO_x/MMBTU Actual Heat Input (this is a voluntary restriction requested by the applicant).

B. Annual emission limit.

The following limits are for the combined emissions from B005, B006, and B007 based on limiting the combined usage of natural gas in these three boilers to 1,080,000,000 CF/yr.

1. 10.8 tons PM/yr.
2. .324 tons SO₂/yr.
3. 75.6 tons NO_x/yr.

5. Operational and/or Production Limitations:

A. Short-term limitation(s):

This permittee shall only burn natural gas in this emissions unit.

This permittee shall limit the combined natural gas usage rate for emissions units B005, B006 and B007 to less than 90,000,000 cubic feet per month.

The combined average operating rate of boilers B005 and B006 shall not exceed 53 MMBTU per hour, for any calendar day. [This limit comes from OAC 3745-18-82(F)].

6. Monitoring and/or Recordkeeping Requirements:

This permittee shall maintain daily records of the combined average operating rate of boilers B005 and B006. This permittee shall also maintain monthly records of the combined amount of natural gas used for emissions units B005, B006 and B007. These daily and monthly records shall be retained in the permittee's files for a period on not less than five years and shall be made available to the Director or any authorized representative of the Director for review during normal business hours.

7. Reporting Requirements:

This permittee shall submit annual reports to the Canton City Health Department, Air Pollution Control Division, 420 Market Avenue N., Canton, Ohio 44702, which summarize the monthly natural gas usage amounts for sources B005, B006 and B007. The reports shall be submitted by February 15 of each year and shall cover the previous calendar year.

The permittee also shall notify the Canton City Health Department of any monthly record which shows a violation of the natural gas usage limitation or the combined average operating rate limitation specified above. This notification shall occur within 30 days following the month during which the exceedence occurred and shall include an explanation of the corrective action which has been or will be taken to achieve compliance.
