The above named entity is hereby granted a permit to install for the above described source(s) pursuant to Chapter 3745-31 of the Ohio Administrative Code. Issuance of this permit does not constitute expressed or implied approval or agreement that, if constructed or modified in accordance with the plans included in the application, the above described source(s) of environmental pollutants will operate in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and regulations, and does not constitute expressed or implied assurance that if constructed or modified in accordance with those plans and specifications, the above described source(s) of pollutants will be granted the necessary permits to operate (air) or NPDES permits as applicable.

This permit is granted subject to the conditions attached hereto.

TERMINATION OF PERMIT TO INSTALL

Substantial construction for installation must take place within 18 months of the effective date of this permit. This deadline may be extended by up to 12 months if application is made to the Director within a reasonable time before the termination date and the party shows good cause for any such extension.

NOTICE OF INSPECTION

The Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, or his authorized representatives, may enter upon the premises of the above-named applicant during construction and operation at any reasonable time for the purpose of making inspections, conducting tests, or to examine records or reports pertaining to the construction, modification or installation of the source(s) of environmental pollutants identified within this permit.

CONSTRUCTION OF NEW SOURCES(S)

The proposed source(s) shall be constructed in strict accordance with the plans and application submitted for this permit to the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency. There may be no deviation from the approved plans without the express, written approval of the Agency. Any deviations from the approved plans or the above conditions may lead to such sanctions and penalties as provided under Ohio law. Approval of these plans does not constitute an assurance that the proposed facilities will operate in compliance with all Ohio laws and regulations. Additional facilities shall be installed upon orders of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency if the proposed sources are inadequate or cannot meet applicable standards.

If the construction of the proposed source(s) has already begun or has been completed prior to the date the Director of the Environmental Protection Agency approves the permit application and plans, the approval does not constitute expressed or implied assurance that the proposed facility has been constructed in accordance with the approved plans. The action of beginning and/or completing construction prior to obtaining the Director's approval constitutes a violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-31-02. Furthermore, issuance of the Permit to Install does not constitute an assurance that the proposed source will operate in compliance with all Ohio laws and regulations. Approval of the plans in any case is not to be construed as an approval of the facility as constructed and/or completed. Moreover, issuance of the Permit to Install is not to be construed as a waiver of any rights that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (or other persons)

may have against the applicant for starting construction prior to the effective date of the permit. Additional facilities shall be installed upon orders of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency if the proposed facilities prove to be inadequate or cannot meet applicable standards.

PERMIT TO INSTALL FEE

In accordance with Ohio Revised Code 3745.11, the specified Permit to Install fee must be remitted within 30 days of the effective date of this permit to install.

PUBLIC DISCLOSURE

The facility is hereby notified that this permit, and all agency records concerning the operation of this permitted source, are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-49-03.

APPLICABILITY

This Permit to Install is applicable only to the contaminant sources identified. Separate application must be made to the Director for the installation or modification of any other contaminant sources.

BEST AVAILABLE TECHNOLOGY

As specified in OAC Rule 3745-31-05, all new sources must employ Best Available Technology (BAT). Compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit will fulfill this requirement.

PERMIT TO OPERATE APPLICATION

A Permit to Operate application must be submitted to the appropriate field office for each air contaminant source in this Permit to Install. In accordance with OAC Rule 3745-35-02, the application shall be filed no later than thirty days after commencement of operation.

SOURCE OPERATION AFTER COMPLETION OF CONSTRUCTION

This facility is permitted to operate each source described by this permit to install for a period of up to one year from the date the source commenced operation. This permission to operate is granted only if the facility complies with all requirements contained in this permit and all applicable air pollution laws, regulations, and policies.

AIR EMISSION SUMMARY

The air contaminant sources listed below comprise the Permit to Install for PROGRESSIVE CHEVROLET COMPANY located in Stark County. The sources listed below shall not exceed the emission limits/control requirements contained in the table. This condition in no way limits the applicability of any other state or federal regulations. Additionally, this condition does not limit the applicability of additional special terms and conditions of this permit.

WASTE DISPOSAL

The owner/operator shall comply with any applicable state and federal requirements governing the storage, treatment, transport and disposal of any waste material generated by the operation of the sources.

MAINTENANCE OF EQUIPMENT

This source and its associated air pollution control system(s) shall be maintained regularly in accordance with good engineering practices and the recommendations of the respective manufacturers in order to minimize air contaminant emissions.

MALFUNCTION/ABATEMENT

In accordance with OAC RULE 3745-15-06, any malfunction of the source(s) or associated air pollution control system(s) shall be reported immediately to the Canton Air Pollution Control, 420 Market Ave. N., City Hall, Canton, Ohio 44702-1544.

Except as provided by OAC Rule 3745-15-06(A)(3), scheduled maintenance of air pollution control equipment that requires the shutdown or bypassing of air pollution control system(s) must be accompanied by the shutdown of the associated air pollution sources.

AIR POLLUTION NUISANCES PROHIBITED

The air contaminant source(s) identified in this permit may not cause a public nuisance in violation of OAC Rule 3745-15-07.

ADDITIONAL SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. VOC Content Limitations

The VOC content of the coatings employed in this source will not exceed 7.5 pounds of VOC per gallon of coating, excluding water.

2. Operational Limitations

The maximum usage of solvent-containing material (coatings, primers, and cleaners) at this source will be a total of 3.5 gallons per day and 74 gallons per month. The maximum emission rate of VOCs from this source will be limited to 1.25 pounds per hour and 2.6 tons per year.

3. Recordkeeping and Reporting Requirements

This facility will maintain monthly records which list the following information for each surface coating or cleanup material employed in this source:

- a. the company identification of the surface coating or cleanup material;
- b. the number of gallons employed by the booth, outside the booth, and the facility total;
- c. the VOC content, in pounds of VOC per gallon of coating;

- d. the water content and exempt solvent in percent by volume;
- e. the gallons of cleanup material used;
- f. the density (in pounds per gallon) of the cleanup material used; and
- g. the total number of hours organic compounds were employed by the facility.

Any exceedance of the source limits will be reported within seven days to Canton City Health Department, Division of Air Pollution Control, 420 Market Avenue, N. Canton, Ohio 44705-1544. Such notification will include, but not be limited to, the amount of coating actually used in gallons per day, and a statement of how the facility will modify operation to comply with the limitations in the future. This notification should be made initially by way of a telephone call or facsimile, but must be followed up by letter. This office should receive the letter within one week of the exceedance.

4. Reporting Requirements

These records, as well as any supporting coating analyses and computations, will be retained in the company's files for a period of not less than three years, and will be made available to any authorized representative of the Director of OEPA for review upon request.

This facility will submit annual reports to Canton City Health Department, Division of Air Pollution Control, 420 Market Avenue N., Canton, Ohio 44705-1544, which summarize the following information for each coating or cleanup material employed in this source during the previous calendar year:

- a. company identification of the surface coating or cleanup material;
- b. the total number of gallons employed;
- c. total VOC emissions (pounds/year);
- d. the VOC content, in pounds of VOC per gallon of coating, minus water and exempt solvent; and
- e. water content and nonvolatile (solids) content.

The report will be submitted by February 15 of each year.

5. Overspray Control

This source will be equipped with a water wash system which removes at least 80% of the PM from the exhaust stream of this source. There will be no visible emissions from these sources.
