

The following terms and conditions are hereby expressly incorporated into this permit to operate:

1. This permit to operate shall be effective until 01/20/98  
 You will be contacted approximately six months prior to this date regarding the renewal of this permit. If you are not contacted, please write to the appropriate Ohio EPA field office.
2. The above-described source is and shall remain in full compliance with all applicable State and federal laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit.
3. Prior to any modification of this source, as defined in rule 3745-31-01 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), a permit to install must be granted by the Ohio EPA pursuant to OAC Chapter 3745-31.
4. The Director of the Ohio EPA or an authorized representative may, subject to the safety requirements of the permit holder, enter upon the premises of this source at any time for purposes of making inspections, conducting tests, examining records or reports pertaining to any emission of air contaminants, and determining compliance with any applicable State and federal air pollution laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit.
5. A permit fee in the amount specified above must be remitted within 15 days from the issuance date of this permit.
6. Any transferee of this permit shall assume the responsibilities of the prior permit holder. The appropriate Ohio EPA field office must be notified in writing of any transfer of this permit.
7. This source and any associated air pollution control system(s) shall be maintained regularly in accordance with good engineering practices in order to minimize air contaminant emissions. Any malfunction of this source or any associated air pollution control system(s) shall be reported immediately to the appropriate Ohio EPA field office in accordance with OAC rule 3745-15-06. Except as provided in that rule, any scheduled maintenance or malfunction necessitating the shutdown or bypassing of any air pollution control system(s) shall be accompanied by the shutdown of this source.
8. Any unauthorized or emergency release of an air contaminant from this source which, due to the toxic or hazardous nature of the material, may pose a threat to public health, or otherwise endanger the safety or welfare of the public, shall be reported immediately to the appropriate Ohio EPA field office (during normal business hours) or to the Ohio EPA's Emergency Response Group (1-800-282-9378). (Additional reporting may be required pursuant to the federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act.)

### *SPECIAL TERMS & CONDITIONS*

1. The following rules of the Ohio Administrative Code establish the applicable emission limitations and/or control requirements of this source:

3745-17-07  
3745-17-08

(This condition in no way limits the applicability of other requirements of the Ohio Administrative Code to this source.)

2. Control of Fugitive Dust from Plant Roadways and Parking Areas

Unpaved roadways and parking areas shall be treated with water or any other suitable dust suppressant in order to minimize or eliminate at all times visible emissions of fugitive dust generated by vehicular traffic. Frequency of application shall be as needed. This term and conditions shall be waived during wet conditions when there is sufficient moisture to prevent visible emissions of fugitive dust.

Paved roadways and parking lots shall be cleaned, as often as necessary, to minimize or eliminate fugitive dust emissions. Dry sweeping without vacuum pick-up is not acceptable.

Any material carried off of the source owner's property and deposited onto the city streets by the vehicular traffic or by erosion by water, etc., shall be promptly removed and disposed of properly in such manner so as to minimize or prevent resuspension.

A maximum speed limit of fifteen (15) miles per hour shall be posted and enforced on the property.

Open bodied vehicles transporting materials likely to become airborne shall be covered at all times.

This facility shall maintain records of when paved surfaces were cleaned and when water or dust suppressants were applied to unpaved surfaces. These records should indicate which roads were treated and the type and quantity of dust suppressants applied. These records shall be maintained for a minimum of one year and shall be made available for inspection by members of the Ohio EPA or its contractual representatives.

3. Visible Emission Limitations for Roadways and Parking Areas

There shall be no visible particulate emissions from any paved roadway or parking area except for a period of time not to exceed six minutes during any sixty-minute observation period.

There shall be no visible particulate emission from any unpaved road or parking area except for a period of time not to exceed thirteen minutes during any sixty-minute observation period.

4. This facility shall submit semi-annual reports to the Canton City Health Department, Division of Air Pollution Control, 420 Market Avenue North, Canton, Ohio 44702, which detail the dust control measures employed to minimize or eliminate fugitive dust emissions from roadways and parking lots. These reports shall be submitted by February 15 and August 15 of each year and shall cover the previous six month period (July - December and January - June, respectively).
