This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

1. For the purpose of a permit-to-install document, the emissions unit terms and conditions identified below are federally enforceable with the exception of those listed below which are enforceable under state law only.

A. Applicable Emissions Limitations and/or Control Requirements

1. The specific operation(s), property, and/or equipment which constitute this emissions unit are listed in the following table along with the applicable rules and/or requirements and with the applicable emissions limitations and/or control measures. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be employed. 2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**
 - (a) The permittee shall employ a baghouse to reduce captured particulate matter emissions by at least 99%.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The permittee shall maintain the baghouse within the range of 4 to 6 inches of water while the emissions unit is in operation.
2. The permittee shall minimize the drop heights of materials fed into the process in order to minimize fugitive dust from the operation.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall properly install, operate, and maintain equipment to monitor the pressure drop across the baghouse while the emissions unit is in operation. The monitoring equipment shall be installed, calibrated, operated, and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, instructions, and operating manual(s). The permittee shall record the pressure drop across the baghouse on a daily basis.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit pressure drop deviation (excursions) reports that identify all periods of time during which the pressure drop across the baghouse did not comply with the allowable range specified above.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the applicable emissions limitations in section A.I of the terms and conditions of this permit shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:
 Emission Limitation: 1.83 lbs PE/hr

 Applicable Compliance Method: The annual PE limits represent the emission unit's potential to emit based upon the information specified by the permittee in its PTO application. Although this permit does not require periodic record keeping to verify compliance with these limits, the permittee shall maintain adequate records in the facility's files to verify that the unit's maximum capacity has not increased.
 Emission Limitation: Visible PE shall not exceed 20% opacity, as a six-minute average, except as provided by rule.

 Applicable Compliance Method: Compliance with the visible PE limitation shall be determined in accordance with the test method and procedures specified in 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, Method 9 in OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(1).
