This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

There shall be no visible particulate emissions from any paved roadway or parking area except for a period of time not to exceed 6 minutes during any 60-minute observation period.
Unpaved roadways and parking areas	OAC rule 3745-17-08 OAC rule 3745-17-07(B) PTI 04-354	See Additional Term and Condition 1.b, below. There shall be no visible particulate emissions from any unpaved roadway or parking area except for a period of time not to exceed 13 minutes during any 60-minute observation period.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The permittee shall sweep the paved roadways and parking areas to minimize or eliminate, at all times, visible emissions of fugitive dust generated by vehicular traffic. The following equipment shall be used to sweep the roadways and parking areas: A self-propelled vacuum sweeper with water flushing. The paved surfaces shall be swept as needed. The permittee shall not be required to sweep during wet conditions when there is sufficient moisture to prevent visible emissions of fugitive dust.

The permittee shall apply dust suppressants to the unpaved roadways and parking areas to minimize or eliminate, at all times, visible emissions of fugitive dust generated by vehicular traffic. Water shall be used as the dust suppressant, and the following equipment shall be used for the periodic applications: water wagon. The dust suppressant shall be applied to the unpaved surfaces as needed. This term and condition shall be waived during wet conditions when there is sufficient moisture to prevent visible emissions of fugitive dust.

Any material carried off of the permittee's property and deposited onto public streets by vehicular traffic or by erosion by water, etc., shall be promptly removed and disposed of properly to minimize or prevent resuspension.

A maximum speed limit of 15 miles per hour for all paved roadways and 10 miles per hour for all unpaved roadways shall be posted and enforced on the property.

Open bodied vehicles transporting materials likely to become airborne shall be covered at all times.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain records for all unpaved roads, paved roads, and parking areas which shall include the following information:
 - i The date the parking area or roadway was treated and/or swept.
 - ii The portions of the paved surfaces that were swept or unpaved surfaces that were treated.
 - iii The name of the equipment operator responsible for the treatment and/or sweeping.
 - iv If the area was not swept or treated, i.e., because of rain, snow, etc., this shall also be recorded.
 - v If for any reason the dust suppressant application equipment and/or sweeper is not operable, the permittee shall record the date the equipment was out of service, the reason and any steps taken to help prevent the downtime from occurring in the future.

All records shall be kept in a central location for a period of five years and shall be made available for

inspection, upon request, by personnel of the Toledo Division of Environmental Services or the Ohio EPA.

Final Cover	OAC rule 3745-17-08 PTI 04-354	The source owner shall plant vegetation as soon as possible on the final cover so as to minimize or eliminate emissions of fugitive dust at all times.
