This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

B. Operational Restrictions

1. None

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall perform daily checks, when the emissions unit is in operation and when weather conditions allow, for any visible emissions from the baghouse and cyclone stacks serving this emissions unit. The presence or absence of any visible emissions shall be noted in an operations log. If visible emissions are observed, the permittee shall also note the following in the operations log:
 - a. the color of the emissions;
 - b. whether the emissions are representative of normal operations;
 - c. if the emissions are not representative of normal operations, the cause of the abnormal emissions ;
 - d. the total duration of any visible emissions incident; and
 - e. any corrective actions taken to eliminate the visible emissions.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit quarterly written deviation (excursion) reports to the Ohio EPA Southeast District Office that identify:
 - a. all days during which any abnormal visible particulate emissions were observed; and
 - b. any corrective actions taken to eliminate the visible emissions.

If no deviations occurred during the calendar quarter, the permittee shall submit a quarterly report which states that no deviations occurred during that quarter.

The deviation reports shall be submitted in accordance with General Terms and Conditions of this permit.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Emission Limitation:

1.4 lbs/hr of PE

Compliance Method:

If required, compliance with this emission limitation shall be determined in accordance with 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, Methods 1-5.

2. Emission Limitation:
6.1 TPYof PE

Compliance Method:

This emission limitation was established by multiplying the pound/hour emission limitation by the actual hours of operation per year and dividing by 2000 pounds per ton.

Compliance with this emission limitation can be assumed provided the permittee complies with the hourly PE limitation.

3. Emission Limitation:
20% opacity as a 6-minute average

Compliance Method:

If required, compliance with the opacity limit shall be determined in accordance with 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, Method 9 and as specified in OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(1).
