This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. 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Part II - Special Terms and Conditions

This permit document constitutes a permit-to-install issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(F) and a permit-to-operate issued in accordance with ORC 3704.03(G).

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- (a) The permittee shall maintain and employ the above ground covered belt line to the screening process. If the coal is not sufficiently wet and is emitting fugitive dust, water or any other chemical dust suppressant shall be applied on an as needed basis in order to minimize or eliminate visible emissions of fugitive dust.
The permittee shall maintain and employ the radial height stacker, so that no visible emissions are observed from the damp coal.

C. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain monthly records of the tons of coal screened and conveyed.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. None

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the mass emission limit in section A.1. of these terms and conditions shall be demonstrated by the use of the coal production records, the emission factors found in Ohio EPA publication titled Reasonably Available Control Measures for Fugitive Dust Sources and the following equation:

Tons of coal processed (tons/yr) x the combined emission factor for conveying and screening (0.02 lb PM/ton) x watering control efficiency (0.20) x ton/2000 lbs = TPY PM.
2. Compliance with the visible particulate emission limitation shall be determined in accordance with the test methods and procedures in OAC 3745-17-03(B)(3).

F. Miscellaneous Requirements

1. The following terms and conditions shall supersede all the air pollution control requirements for this emissions unit contained in permit to install 17-1449 as issued on 2-22-96: A-E.
