You are hereby notified that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency has made a draft action recommending that the Director issue a Permit to Install modification for the air contaminant source(s) [emissions unit(s)] shown on the enclosed draft permit modification. This draft action is not an authorization to begin construction or modification of your emissions unit(s). The purpose of this draft is to solicit public comments on the proposed installation. A public notice concerning the draft permit will appear in the Ohio EPA Weekly Review and the newspaper in the county where the facility will be located. Public comments will be accepted by the field office within 30 days of the date of publication in the newspaper. Any comments you have on the draft permit modification should be directed to the appropriate field office within the comment period. A copy of your comments should also be mailed to Robert Hodanbosi, Division of Air Pollution Control, Ohio EPA, P.O. Box 1049, Columbus, OH, 43266-0149.

A Permit to Install modification may be issued in proposed or final form based on the draft action, any written public comments received within 30 days of the public notice, or record of a public meeting if one is held. You will be notified in writing of a scheduled public meeting. Upon issuance of a final Permit to Install modification a fee of **\$ 375** will be due. Please do not submit any payment now.

The above named entity is hereby granted a modification to the permit to install described above pursuant to Chapter 3745-31 of the Ohio Administrative Code. Issuance of this modification does not constitute expressed or implied approval or agreement that, if constructed or modified in accordance with the plans included in the application, the above described source(s) of environmental pollutants will operate in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and regulations, and does not constitute expressed or implied assurance that if constructed or modified in accordance with those plans included in the application, the above described source(s) of pollutants will be granted the necessary operating permits.

This permit is granted subject to the conditions attached hereto.

Part I - GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. Permit to Install General Terms and Conditions

1. Compliance Requirements

The emissions unit(s) identified in this Permit to Install shall remain in full compliance with all applicable State laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit.

2. Reporting Requirements

The permittee shall submit required reports in the following manner:

- a. Reports of any required monitoring and/or recordkeeping information shall be submitted to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency.
- b. Except as otherwise may be provided in the terms and conditions for a specific emissions unit, quarterly written reports of (a) any deviations (excursions) from emission limitations, operational restrictions, and control device operating parameter limitations that have been detected by the testing, monitoring, and recordkeeping requirements specified in this permit, (b) the probable cause of such deviations, and (c) any corrective actions or preventive measures which have been or will be taken, shall be submitted to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency. If no deviations occurred during a calendar quarter, the permittee shall submit a quarterly report, which states that no deviations occurred during that quarter. The reports shall be submitted quarterly, i.e., by January 31, April 30, July 31, and October 31 of each year and shall cover the previous calendar quarters. (These quarterly reports shall exclude deviations resulting from malfunctions reported in accordance with OAC rule 3745-15-06.)

3. Records Retention Requirements

Each record of any monitoring data, testing data, and support information required pursuant to this permit shall be retained for a period of five years from the date the record was created. Support information shall include, but not be limited to, all calibration and maintenance records and all original strip-chart recordings for continuous monitoring instrumentation, and copies of all reports required by this permit. Such records may be maintained in computerized form.

4. Inspections and Information Requests

The Director of the Ohio EPA, or an authorized representative of the Director, may, subject to the safety requirements of the permittee and without undue delay, enter upon the premises of this source at any reasonable time for purposes of making inspections, conducting tests, examining records or reports pertaining to any emission of air contaminants, and determining compliance with any applicable State air pollution laws and

regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit. The permittee shall furnish to the Director of the Ohio EPA, or an authorized representative of the Director, upon receipt of a written request and within a reasonable time, any information that may be requested to determine whether cause exists for modifying, reopening or revoking this permit or to determine compliance with this permit. Upon verbal or written request, the permittee shall also furnish to the Director of the Ohio EPA, or an authorized representative of the Director, copies of records required to be kept by this permit.

5. Scheduled Maintenance/Malfunction Reporting

Any scheduled maintenance of air pollution control equipment shall be performed in accordance with paragraph (A) of OAC rule 3745-15-06. The malfunction of any emissions units or any associated air pollution control system(s) shall be reported to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency in accordance with paragraph (B) of OAC rule 3745-15-06. Except as provided in that rule, any scheduled maintenance or malfunction necessitating the shutdown or bypassing of any air pollution control system(s) shall be accompanied by the shutdown of the emissions unit(s) that is (are) served by such control system(s).

6. Permit Transfers

Any transferee of this permit shall assume the responsibilities of the prior permit holder. The appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency must be notified in writing of any transfer of this permit.

7. Air Pollution Nuisance

The air contaminants emitted by the emissions units covered by this permit shall not cause a public nuisance, in violation of OAC rule 3745-15-07.

8. Termination of Permit to Install

This Permit to Install shall terminate within eighteen months of the effective date of the Permit to Install if the owner or operator has not undertaken a continuing program of installation or modification or has not entered into a binding contractual obligation to undertake and complete within a reasonable time a continuing program of installation or modification. This deadline may be extended by up to 12 months if application is made to the Director within a reasonable time before the termination date and the party shows good cause for any such extension.

9. Construction of New Sources(s)

The proposed emissions unit(s) shall be constructed in strict accordance with the plans and application submitted for this permit to the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency. There may be no deviation from the approved plans without the express, written approval of the Agency. Any deviations from the approved plans or the above conditions

may lead to such sanctions and penalties as provided under Ohio law. Approval of these plans does not constitute an assurance that the proposed facilities will operate in compliance with all Ohio laws and regulations. Additional facilities shall be installed upon orders of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency if the proposed sources cannot meet the requirements of this permit or cannot meet applicable standards.

If the construction of the proposed emissions unit(s) has already begun or has been completed prior to the date the Director of the Environmental Protection Agency approves the permit application and plans, the approval does not constitute expressed or implied assurance that the proposed facility has been constructed in accordance with the approved plans. The action of beginning and/or completing construction prior to obtaining the Director's approval constitutes a violation of OAC rule 3745-31-02. Furthermore, issuance of the Permit to Install does not constitute an assurance that the proposed source will operate in compliance with all Ohio laws and regulations. Approval of the plans in any case is not to be construed as an approval of the facility as constructed and/or completed. Moreover, issuance of the Permit to Install is not to be construed as a waiver of any rights that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (or other persons) may have against the applicant for starting construction prior to the effective date of the permit. Additional facilities shall be installed upon orders of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency if the proposed facilities cannot meet the requirements of this permit or cannot meet applicable standards.

10. Public Disclosure

The facility is hereby notified that this permit, and all agency records concerning the operation of this permitted source, are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC rule 3745-49-03.

11. Applicability

This Permit To Install is applicable only to the emissions unit(s) identified in the Permit To Install. Separate Permit To Install for the installation or modification of any other emissions unit(s) are required for any emissions unit for which a Permit To Install is required.

12. Best Available Technology

As specified in OAC Rule 3745-31-05, all new sources must employ Best Available Technology (BAT). Compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit will fulfill this requirement.

13. Source Operation and Operating Permit Requirements After Completion of Construction

This facility is permitted to operate each source described by this Permit to Install for a period of up to one year from the date the source commenced operation. This permission to operate is granted only if the facility complies with all requirements contained in this

permit and all applicable air pollution laws, regulations, and policies. Pursuant to OAC Chapter 3745-35, the permittee shall submit a complete operating permit application within ninety (90) days after commencing operation of the emissions unit(s) covered by this permit.

14. Construction Compliance Certification

The applicant shall provide Ohio EPA with a written certification (see enclosed form) that the facility has been constructed in accordance with the Permit to Install application and the terms and conditions of the Permit to Install. The certification shall be provided to Ohio EPA upon completion of construction but prior to startup of the source.

15. Fees

The permittee shall pay fees to the Director of the Ohio EPA in accordance with ORC section 3745.11 and OAC Chapter 3745-78. The permittee shall pay all applicable Permit to Install fees within 30 days after the issuance of this Permit to Install.

1. Emissions from this unit shall not exceed the listed limitations, and the listed control measures shall be specified in narrative form following the table.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- 2.a** The hourly and annual emission limitations were established for PTI purposes to reflect the potential to emit for this emissions unit. Therefore, it is not necessary to develop monitoring, record keeping and/or reporting requirements to ensure compliance with these limitations.
- 2.b** The emission limitation specified by this rule is less stringent than the emission limitation established pursuant to OAC rule 3745-31-05(C).
- 2.c** The permittee has satisfied the "latest available control techniques and operating practices" required pursuant to OAC rule 3745-21-07(B) by committing to comply with the best available technology requirements established pursuant to OAC rule 3745-31-05(A)(3) in this Permit to Install.

B. Operational Restrictions

- 1. The permittee shall operate the material handling system baghouse whenever this emissions unit is in operation.

C. Monitoring and/or Recordkeeping Requirements

- 1. The permittee shall maintain daily records that document any time periods when the material handling system baghouse was not in service when the emissions unit was in operation.
- 2. The permittee shall perform daily checks, when the emissions unit is in operation and when the weather conditions allow, for any visible particulate emissions from the stacks serving this emissions unit. The presence or absence of any visible emissions shall be noted in an operations log. If visible emissions are observed, the permittee shall also note the following in the operations log:

- a. the location of the emissions;
- b. the color of the emissions;
- c. the total duration of any visible emission incident; and
- d. any corrective actions taken to eliminate the visible emissions.

If visible emissions are present, a visible emission incident has occurred. The observer does not have to document the exact start and end times for the visible emission incident under item (c) above or continue the daily check until the incident has ended. The observer may indicate that the visible emission incident was continuous during the observation period (or, if known, continuous during the operation of the emissions unit). With respect to the documentation of corrective actions, the observer may indicate that no corrective actions were taken if the visible emissions were representative of normal operations, or specify the minor corrective actions that were taken to ensure that the emissions unit continued to operate under normal conditions, or specify the corrective actions that were taken to eliminate abnormal visible emissions.

3. If the daily checks show no visible emissions for 4 consecutive operating weeks, the required frequency of visible emissions checks may be reduced to monthly (once per month, when the emissions unit is in operation). If a subsequent check by the permittee or an Ohio EPA inspector indicates visible emissions, the frequency of emissions checks shall revert to weekly until such time as there are 4 consecutive operating weeks of no visible emissions.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (the Toledo Division of Environmental Services) in writing of any daily record showing that the material handling system baghouse was not in service when the emissions unit was in operation. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director (the Toledo Division of Environmental Services) by January 31 and July 31 of each year and shall cover the previous 6-month period.
2. The permittee shall submit semiannual written reports that (a) identify all days during which any visible particulate emissions were observed from any stack serving this emissions unit and (b) describe any corrective actions taken to eliminate the visible particulate emissions. These reports shall be submitted to the Director (the Toledo Division of Environmental Services) by January 31 and July 31 of each year and shall cover the previous 6-month period.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the emission limitation(s) in Section A.I. of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following method(s):

a. Emission Limitation:

10% opacity as a six-minute average (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

If required, compliance shall be determined through visible emission observations performed in accordance with Method 9 of 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A using the methods and procedures specified in OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(1).

b. Emission Limitation:

20% opacity as a six-minute average (material handling system baghouse stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

If required, compliance shall be determined through visible emission observations performed in accordance with Method 9 of 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A using the methods and procedures specified in OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(1).

c. Emission Limitation:

PE shall not exceed 2.31 pounds per hour (material handling system baghouse stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

If required, the permittee shall demonstrate compliance with this emission limitation through emission testing performed in accordance with Methods 1 thru 5 of 40 CFR Part 60 Appendix A using the methods and procedures specified in OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(10).

d. Emission Limitation:

PE shall not exceed 10.12 tons as a rolling, 12-month summation (material handling system baghouse stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

This emission limitation was developed by multiplying the hourly allowable particulate emission limitation (2.31 lb/hr) by the maximum annual hours of operation (8760 hrs), and then dividing by 2000 lbs/ton. Therefore, if compliance is shown with the hourly limitation, compliance shall also be shown with the annual emission limitation.

e. Emission Limitation:

PE shall not exceed 0.13 pound per hour (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

If required, the permittee shall demonstrate compliance with this emission limitation through emission testing performed in accordance with Methods 1 thru 5 of 40 CFR Part 60 Appendix A using the methods and procedures specified in OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(10).

f. Emission Limitation:

PE shall not exceed 0.57 ton as a rolling, 12-month summation (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

This emission limitation was developed by multiplying the hourly allowable particulate emission limitation (0.13 lb/hr) by the maximum annual hours of operation (8760 hrs), and then dividing by 2000 lbs/ton. Therefore, if compliance is shown with the hourly limitation, compliance shall also be shown with the annual emission limitation.

g. Emission Limitation:

VOC shall not exceed 1.14 pounds per hour (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

If required, the permittee shall demonstrate compliance with this emission limitation through emission testing performed in accordance with the methods and procedures specified in OAC rule 3745-21-10(C).

h. Emission Limitation:

VOC shall not exceed 5.00 tons as a rolling, 12-month summation (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

This emission limitation was developed by multiplying the hourly allowable VOC emission limitation (1.14 lb/hr) by the maximum annual hours of operation (8760 hrs), and then dividing by 2000 lbs/ton. Therefore, if compliance is shown with the hourly limitation, compliance shall also be shown with the annual emission limitation.

i. Emission Limitation:

ammonia emissions shall not exceed 0.07 pound per hour (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

If required, the permittee shall demonstrate compliance through stack testing performed in accordance with Method 301 of 40 CFR Part 63 Appendix A. Alternate, USEPA approved test methods, may be used with prior written approval.

j. Emission Limitation:

ammonia emissions shall not exceed 0.31 ton as a rolling, 12-month summation (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

This emission limitation was developed by multiplying the hourly allowable ammonia limitation (0.07 lb/hr) by the maximum annual hours of operation (8760 hrs), and then dividing by 2000 lbs/ton. Therefore, if compliance is shown with the hourly limitation, compliance shall also be shown with the annual emission limitation.

k. Emission Limitation:

formaldehyde emissions shall not exceed 0.16 pound per hour (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

If required, the permittee shall demonstrate compliance through stack testing performed in accordance with Method 320 of 40 CFR Part 63 Appendix A. Alternate, USEPA approved test methods, may be used with prior written approval.

l. Emission Limitation:

formaldehyde emissions shall not exceed 0.70 ton as a rolling, 12-month summation (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

This emission limitation was developed by multiplying the hourly allowable formaldehyde limitation (0.16 lb/hr) by the maximum annual hours of operation (8760 hrs), and then dividing by 2000 lbs/ton. Therefore, if compliance is shown with the hourly limitation, compliance shall also be shown with the annual emission limitation.

m. Emission Limitation:

phenol emissions shall not exceed 0.12 pound per hour (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

If required, the permittee shall demonstrate compliance through stack testing performed in accordance with Method 320 of 40 CFR Part 63 Appendix A. Alternate, USEPA approved test methods, may be used with prior written approval.

n. Emission Limitation:

phenol emissions shall not exceed 0.53 ton as a rolling, 12-month summation (semi-cure oven stack)

Applicable Compliance Method:

This emission limitation was developed by multiplying the hourly allowable phenol limitation (0.12 lb/hr) by the maximum annual hours of operation (8760 hrs), and then dividing by 2000 lbs/ton. Therefore, if compliance is shown with the hourly limitation, compliance shall also be shown with the annual emission limitation.

F. Miscellaneous Requirements

1. The terms and conditions contained in this Permit to Install for emissions unit P006 supercede all requirements for P006 contained in PTI 04-1048 as issued February 26, 1997.
2. All requirements of Sections A through E. of this permit to install are federally enforceable.
