Andrew-

This question was brought up yesterday in my office, so I was going to ask you about it. But since today is the scheduled APL, I thought I would just ask it then. I wanted to give you a head's up on the question:

"I have a TVPTI issued in 2005 that has a pressure drop range term as an operational restriction. Per current TVPTO renewal guidance, we are to move pressure drop range terms from the operational restriction section to the monitoring section. However, if the underlying PTI has the term as an operational restriction, can we move it to the monitoring section in the TVPTO? If yes, to avoid conflicting terms, do we need to modify the PTI to move the term to the monitoring section?"

FYI: Most PTIs are old and vague, so they didn't spell out pressure drop ranges and monitoring. These type of terms were first introduced in the TVPTO. So changing term placement in the TVPTO does not impact the PTI in those cases. Since this case is different, I wanted to ask if there was a different approach.
