**REVISED PUBLIC NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA)-Division of Surface Water (DSW) has scheduled a public hearing on the draft National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for the discharge from the proposed Clermont County-Wards Corner Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant. This is a correction of the May 26, 2005 Public Notice that incorrectly listed the Sycamore Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant.

The Clermont County-Wards Corner Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant is proposed to be located at 458 Loveland-Miamiville Road, Miami Township, Clermont County, Ohio. Treated wastewaters are proposed to be discharged at the same location. The proposed discharges are to an unnamed tributary of the Little Miami River and Subsequently the Little Miami River. The NPDES application was submitted by the Clermont County Sewer District on behalf of the Clermont County Board of Commissioners, 2379 Clermont Center Drive, Batavia, Ohio 45103.

The discharges from this facility, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of an unnamed tributary of the Little Miami River and subsequently the Little Miami River. However, the chemical-specific water quality criteria developed to protect aquatic life and human health, set forth in OAC 3745-1-07, will not be exceeded. In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality.

The public hearing has been scheduled for 7:00 P.M. on Thursday, July 21, 2005 at Milford High School, 1 Eagles Way, Milford, Ohio 45150. The public hearing will end when everyone in attendance has had an opportunity to provide testimony related to the project. The Preferred Alternative involves the construction of an extension of Alum Creek Drive to provide vehicular access to a proposed intermodal Facility (IMF). Alum Creek would be extended southward for approximately 3.4 miles from its intersection with Port Road. The construction of the extension is estimated to directly impact 1,776 linear feet of jurisdictional streams (Stream segments 2A and 2B) and two roadside ditches that exhibit stream characteristics (Ditches JD-E and JD-I). In addition, 0.045 acres of jurisdictional wetlands would be impacted.

The Minimal Degradation Alternative is basically the same as the Preferred Alternative. However, stream segment 2B would not be impacted, resulting in a total of 1,196 linear feet of stream impacts (Stream segments 2A and Ditch JD-E and JD-I). A total of 0.061 acres of jurisdictional wetlands would be impacted by this alternative.

The Non-Degradation Alternative consists of not making any construction modifications (“no build”) or leaving the existing roadway structures intact. This alternative will not result in impacts to aquatic resources. However, the applicant states that this alternative would not meet the “Purpose and Need” of the project.
